



Astcote High Street Closure

At last some proper repairs are to be carried out on Astcote High Street. As this will mean patching extensive areas it will require closure of the Road (between Suttons Walk and the A5) at off peak times and removal of parked cars. This will take place from October 3rd for up to three weeks. The alternative route to and from the A5 is via School Road and Butchers lane.

We have received some generous grants and donations for the extension and refurbishment. We have recently been awarded £1000 from the David Laing Foundation, £1000 from Maud Elkington Trust, £1500 from Constance Travis Trust, £50 from Sir Derek Greenaway Foundation and £7171 from South Northants Leisure Trust. South Northants Council are planning to install solar panels on the hall roof. They will install and maintain the panels through a grant and the hall will benefit from a proportion of 'free' electricity from the panels The result of the application to the Big Lottery for the main part of the refurbishment project will be known by December. New lighting and ceiling tiles have been installed in the large hall.

The path to the tennis court has been re-laid and a root barrier installed to prevent further damage to the court. Tennis coaching starts in September for all age groups. Phone 07912 746693 for details. Next year we hope to improve the front of the hall with some planting. A prize of £500, awarded for environmental improvement, was won by Roger Clarke and will be used for this project.

Cold Higham Parish Council

Following the report in the last Around Pattishall that the parish council received six nominations for the elections earlier this year there is currently a vacancy for a seventh councillor. We have now been given permission by South Northants Council to co-opt a new member rather than arrange a full by-election. Ideally the parish council would like to co-opt someone from a part of the parish that is currently under-represented (from Fosters Booth, perhaps) but members from any part of the community will of course be considered. In the first instance, please discuss with one of the existing parish councillors or contact Pauline Pearson, the parish clerk, on 01327 830287.

BT has written to the parish council to ask if we would like to purchase the public telephone box on Banbury Lane in Cold Higham. Many small villages have taken up a similar offer in other parts of the country, with some interesting outcomes, and the parish council would like to hear the views of residents before making its final decision. The costs of buying the phone box are not especially high but there are a few small ongoing costs that would have to be met in the future. We are, however, aware that the phone box is a village "landmark" and would like to find a way of retaining it in the village or nearby. Options include buying the telephone to keep it as a working unit, retaining the box with no working telephone so that it can be used for other purposes, or purchasing the box and relocating it to another site within the village. Please contact one of the councillors if you have any views or suggestions.

South Northants Council will be conducting a survey throughout Cold Higham Parish during September or October to assess current and future housing requirements. Similar surveys have been held in every other parish in the district as part of the council's long term planning. The survey comprises a simple form which will be sent to every household. The results will be collated by the council to form an overview of housing requirements. It's an important exercise and we urge all residents to spend a few minutes completing and returning the forms.

The dog fouling in the cemetery and churchyard does appear to have decreased over the past couple of months but we would remind and request all residents to prevent their dogs from entering these areas whenever possible and to clean up after them if fouling should occur.

The Trustees of the Charity were pleased to award grants to 13 students in 2010/11, 2 of whom were on apprentice schemes. The latter were in keeping with Thomas Waites's wishes who wanted to support young people to buy "tools of the trade." The Trustees recognise the need to keep up to date with changes in the education system so as well as buying equipment will also provide grants for books and other resources.

Poors Allotment Charity

Cold Higham / Grimscote

The trustees of the above charity are able to "apply the income of the Charity in relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the parish of Cold Higham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress, by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons".

In practice this means that funds may be available for:

- 1. Households with at least one householder being aged 65 or over for heating purposes
- 2. Young people or students needing to purchase books or tools or to pay for travelling expenses
- 3. Any other person in need or distress

Because of the difficulties experienced by the trustees in identifying eligible persons it is requested that those wishing to claim a grant should apply in writing to the clerk - Keith Wootton, 7 Church Lane, Cold Higham, NN12 8LS. Email applications can also be made at <u>grants@coldhigham.org.uk</u>. Applications should be received by 11th November 2011.

Those aged over 65 who already receive a grant do not need to re-apply.

Affordable Housing for Cold Higham

South Northamptonshire Council want to assess housing need in the parish of Cold Higham. This will help us decide whether an affordable housing development will be required for local people.

The starting point to identifying housing need will be a Housing Needs Survey which will be distributed to each household in the parish (that is to the villages of Cold Higham, Grimscote, Potcote, and part of Fosters Booth).

The survey covers two areas. First, general views from residents about a small affordable housing development in Cold Higham, should one be required for local people; second the actual housing need within the village. The survey form will be delivered to each household during the last week of September and should be returned, in the pre paid envelope provided, to South Northamptonshire Council, who will undertake the analysis of the results. Please be assured that all replies are confidential.

The analysis of the survey will find out who:

- · Needs to move in the next 5 years
- Wants to live in the parish of Cold Higham
- Has a strong local connection to the parish

Every form counts, so please take the time to complete the survey. It's a chance for you to have your say, even if you don't have a need for housing yourself, you may know family members or local people who do have a need. If the results indicate a local housing need, the information gathered will help to identify the appropriate number and type of housing for people with local connections to the village.

Northamptonshire ACRE Bulk Oil Buying Scheme

Northamptonshire ACRE is concerned about the level of fuel poverty across the county and is looking at practical ways of being able to help our local, rural communities. One of our sister organisations, Oxfordshire Rural Community Council (ORCC) has recently set up a new social enterprise that will reduce the cost of domestic heating oil with each order simply by joining a community-based countywide oil buying syndicate. By bringing communities together throughout the county and making the most of joint buying power, huge savings can be made and passed on directly to people whose fuel costs are high simply because they have oil-fired central heating. By operating county-wide, the scheme makes it possible for new or existing local community oil buying groups to make the most of their collective purchasing power. Members pay a small annual fee to join (which is generally recouped in the savings from the first order!) before negotiations take place with every oil company that supplies premises in the county to ensure the best price is achieved.

Thus far, the Oxfordshire scheme is proving a great success, so we are conducting some initial research to find out what level of interest there is to run a similar scheme in Northamptonshire. Better Broadband?

The letter below has been sent to Pattishall School and offers a pilot for community broadband from a Company called embc. If you are interested in participating or knowing more about the initiative, please contact Brian Curtis via email: <u>head@pattishall.northants-ecl.gov.uk</u> If there is sufficient interest Brian will register with the company and find out if our Parish would meet the criteria for the pilot.

Helping your rural community get better broadband .. and getting a better connection at lower cost for the school

Large numbers of villages in the East Midlands have poor or non-existent broadband provision. However, in many of those communities, embc has helped the school get a good quality broadband connection. Maybe your school is one of those.

The good news is that, just as embc has helped you get a good internet connection; it is possible that your connection could be upgraded so that it could also enable much better broadband for your local community. It's also possible that this could be partly funded out of the £500 million pounds the government has promised to County Councils to tackle the problem of broadband "not-spots" around the country.

embc, in partnership with the County Council staff that are putting together the bids for Government funding for rural broadband, is looking at how it could work with schools to help make this happen in a way that would benefit both the schools and their local communities.

The router in the school would connect to a community hub outside the school, and there would be a completely separate connection over that for local homes and businesses. A commercial company would handle all the issues relating to the provision of broadband to homes and businesses using that connection.

There should be no extra work or complications for the school. In fact the school could even see improved broadband speeds and / or reduced costs. Local pupils will see the benefit of better broadband at home, and through its partnership in the scheme, the school could see financial benefits, effectively reducing the cost of its own broadband connection.

However, at the moment, while we know this is possible, the details still need to be worked out in practice. embc is therefore looking for around ten schools and local communities interested in investigating this with us. If your school has its broadband coming over fibre and if there is a campaign already running in your local community to get better broadband, we would be interested in hearing from you. Even if you are not sure about your own connection, but know that the local parish council or groups of residents and businesses are working to find a solution to broadband issues, we may be able to help.

All we are looking for initially is a willingness to explore the issues with us. It would simply mean one or two meetings to help us scope out the opportunity. If that indicates that there might be a commercially viable solution to provide broadband to the community using the school's connection, then a clear proposal would be put together, showing in detail any minor works that might be needed to take the connection out of the school premises to a community hub and the benefits to the school in terms of better connectivity and/or lower costs. The decision about whether or not to go forward would then be completely up to the school staff and governors.

Of course, at the end of the day, we cannot be sure that a viable solution could be found for each of the pilots. However, at the very least, each community would gain a clearer understanding of the options available to them.
