

Pattishall Neighbourhood Watch

NHW Street Wardens are/have been delivering "Home Security Leaflets" to all households in Pattishall Parish. These have been printed (35,000) by South Northants NHW Area Support Team, with lottery funding, for the whole of South Northants. There are useful contact numbers on the back of the leaflet. If you haven't received a leaflet and would like one please contact the Co-ordinator.

A Police e-newsletter is now sent to NHW Co-ordinators bi-monthly. The newsletter includes locally identified priorities, incidents and other concerns. This e-newsletter is passed on to Street Wardens and residents on the email loop. If you wish to be included on the email loop and receive crime information please contact your Street Warden or the Co-ordinator. If you are not on email and wish to receive information please also contact the Co-ordinator.

The telephone number used to report non-emergency crimes has been changed to 101. (previously 03000 111 222). This number is at a fixed rate of 15 pence per call. This can also be used to speak to your local safer community team. HOWEVER, PATTISHALL PARISH RESIDENTS SHOULD CONTINUE TO USE 01604 432436 TO REPORT CRIME. SUSPICIOUS VEHICLES/PERSONS/PEDDLARS ETC.. THIS NUMBER RECEIVES THE HIGHEST PRIORITY AFTER 999 and is used by villages with NHW groups. If you have cause to report anything to the police please would you inform the Co-ordinator.

Holy Cross Wildflower Garden


The wildflower garden at Holy Cross is an attractive public amenity and has been managed over recent years on an ad hoc basis. Because of its relatively undisturbed nature it is a sanctuary for wild flora and fauna and in a recent survey was found to contain 82 wildflower species, a number of grass species and 16 trees and shrubs.

The garden was created as a millennium project because as an ancient burial ground it had become very overgrown and unmanageable. At present the wildflower garden consists of only part of the existing graveyard but it is proposed that in time management will be extended to other parts of the south side of the churchyard.

As part of the Parish Plan a small group has produced a provisional management plan for initially the ensuing twelve months which will take into account cutting back of intrusive shrubs and undergrowth and allowing more light into the area by careful removal of some lower branches of trees. This will promote the growth of existing wildflowers and will facilitate any further planting schemes should they arise.

In keeping with the Parish Plan, tasking is on a voluntary basis and the group would welcome those with an interest in the project to contact them with a view to providing assistance as and when required. It is hoped that from this it will be possible to set up a more long term working plan with new ideas and a vision for the future for the wildflower garden.





Northamptonshire Acre's Bulk Oil Buying Scheme

Northamptonshire ACRE is delighted to announce the launch of a new venture that we hope will be good for you, good for the environment and good for Northamptonshire ACRE.

WHAT'S THE SCHEME?

Northamptonshire ACRE will be using the model of a local buying syndicate for domestic heating oil and rolling it out across the county. We believe there will be great strength in harnessing the purchasing power of the many rural communities who are without mains gas so that together, oil-buyers will be able to make significant savings. Experience has already shown that it's possible to get a discount of around £50 on a single order. And since the scheme is only in its infancy, we see no reason why we can't improve on that. There are other benefits too – reduced carbon footprint (yes, really), a move towards renewable energy sources and a contribution to funds to support Northamptonshire.

WHY IS NORTHAMPTONSHIRE ACRE DOING THIS?

As a publicly funded charity, we know that there will be difficult times ahead and we want to safeguard our future and our ability to advise and support rural communities across Northamptonshire. Our aim is that not only will we help households to save money – especially important in Northamptonshire's rural areas where we know there is far greater 'fuel poverty' than in our urban areas - but we will also be able to generate some income for Northamptonshire ACRE. And you can be entirely confident that this is not a scam – it's simply about bulk-buying.

AREN'T THERE LOTS OF SYNDICATES ALREADY IN EXISTENCE?

Yes. We don't know exactly how many but there are some communities who have been doing this locally for some while. We have no wish to take any schemes over — but if that local purchasing power can be scaled up to something much bigger, then everyone will benefit. And for communities who don't yet have a local scheme, this provides an easy way for you to get one, with very little work.

WHAT ARE YOU ASKING OF ME?

We are an organisation that is rooted in local community action, and we want to run the scheme in a way that reflects this philosophy. So we are looking for local people to play a part in getting things off the ground and helping it to grow.

The key to making this work will be having a network of community coordinators who are willing to collate local members' monthly oil orders and pass them on to us, and who will then let the local members know the cost per litre and the delivery date. That's pretty much it. No negotiating oil prices, no handling money. For doing this, you will get FREE membership of the scheme – an annual saving of £20. We know that our newsletter readers are keen and active participants in local community life and your local networks and contacts will be important – the more members the scheme has, the stronger the buying power! We hope you will be willing to take on this very modest role so that we can get up and running in your village.


New look Pattishall Parish Website

Girls Got Tough! In Jordan

Thank you to all those in the Parish who supported me in whatever way to achieve the Jordan Desert Trek, featured in previous editions of *Around Pattishall*. I was raising funds for *Wellbeing of Women*, which funds medical research on all matters concerned with women and pregnancy, and raised over £3,300. The whole group raised a total of over £90,000, so it was well worth doing from that point of view!


I completed the Challenge – a trek from the lowest place on earth (the Dead Sea) to the Rose Red ancient city of Petra in Jordan, about 50 miles. We were lucky with the weather – it stayed between 25C and 31C – and were supported by four great donkeys, who carried the water. We walked/climbed for between 8 and 11 hours each of the five days, and slept in Bedouin camps each night, sleeping either in Bedouin tents or under the stars, and arrived in Petra at noon on the last day. We flew back on 5th November and I arrived in the village just in time for the great firework display! Good timing!

It was a great challenge and a wonderful experience – the group is now talking of tackling Kilimajaro in 2013, but we'll see...!
