# Astcote High Street Closure

The Parish Council have been informed that there will be further repairs to Astcote High Street which will be closed (after peak morning times) for 5 days towards the end of February. Residents should always be able to get in and out one way or the other.

#### Pattishall Parochial Charities

The Pattishall Parochial Charity has funds available to support residents of the Parish. You may already be aware of the Widow and Widowers monthly pension. This is given to fifteen applicants who currently receive a monthly pension of £30. At present there is a waiting list but anyone wishing to apply should write to the Clerk stating date of birth and number of years resident in the Parish. Others can apply separately to receive a Christmas Grant to help with their heating or fuel expenses - currently £60 per household.

Besides these regular grants the funds can be used for other specific, one-off requirements within the community. Although not age dependant, there should be a proven need. Examples of grants made in the past are:

- Installation of walk in shower
- Widening of path and fitting of hand rail
- Travelling fees hospital visits
- Pre school fees

Each application would be at the discretion of the Trustees.

# New Crime Prevention Web Page

Members of the public can now find all the information they need about personal and home security on a dedicated new web page launched by Northamptonshire Police.

The new page provides a 'one stop shop' for anyone who wants to find out more about how to prevent crime and reduce their risk of becoming a victim.

The section incorporates a range of information, from how to make your home and car more secure to how to set up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme, together with information about business and rural crime as well as advice on how to prevent fraud and improve online security.

There is useful advice on property marking, which can make valuables less attractive to thieves and help link criminals back to crime scenes or identify handlers of stolen goods. It can also help police identify stolen goods so they can be returned to their rightful owner.

In addition, the site hosts an Interactive Virtual Neighbourhood (courtesy of Leicestershire Constabulary), which offers another way to get useful advice about how to protect property and prevent different types of crime.

Crime Prevention Manager Laura Major said: "The new section brings all our crime prevention advice and related subjects into one place and we hope it will make it easier for members of the public to find the information they need to help them better protect their home and property."

# Getting to Know Irene

A few weeks ago I met Irene Willmott while she was walking her dogs and instead of our usual "Good morning, lovely day today," we actually stopped and chatted. During the course of our conversation Irene told me about the terrible deafness she had to cope with for ten years before she had a cochlea implant in January 2008 to restore most of her hearing. She also told me of the terrible isolation she experienced in being unable to hear and particularly because of her inability to communicate with other people and that during this time she wrote poetry to express her frustration.

Irene's story has made me wonder how many other deaf people there are in the parish and those with other difficulties and disabilities that have caused them frustration and even anger, who would be really pleased to read poems that express these emotions.

Irene's cochlea implant operation was carried out at Addenbrookes Hospital whose staff were so impressed by her poems that they encouraged her to have them printed in a small book so that they could help patients enduring similar

difficulties. This book has been given the title Poems from the Heart and this title says it all and to choose a tiny selection to include in this article has been very difficult but here are just three.

#### Lonely

Why do I feel all alone Even when people are near? Why do they have a moan When I say sorry I didn't hear?

I don't think they understand What deafness is really like They bury their heads in the sand And hope we'll go out of sight.

We must work together and try to teach About our unpleasant plight Maybe they will stretch out their arms And pull us into the light.

All we need is to be understood It's not hard to ask A tap on the shoulder please Instead of pushing past.

We only want a normal life
For things to be as they were
Sometimes the little things you do
Make it very heard to bear.

But I think there will come a time When things will all come right When hearing people are more aware And the deaf ones win the fight.

#### I'm Deaf

Why do you look at me like that With a frown upon your face? I'm trying hard to understand But you see I'm deaf.

If you wish to talk to me
I'm willing to oblige
But there are things you must do
To help us through
Because you see I'm deaf.

First you have to look at me
I won't think it rude

Your lips I'll gladly read
For I know I'm deaf.

There are lots of ways for you
To help communicate

# Cold Higham Parish Council

As part of the changes that are taking place within local government, we were approached recently by South Northants Council to see if we would consider taking on more responsibilities in the parish. In particular SNC wanted to pass the maintenance of "closed" churchyards like ours, where burials no longer take place, to village and parish councils rather than continue to carry out the work itself. Various options were considered but as we are already responsible for the

adjoining cemetery we felt that a single contract covering the grass cutting and similar tasks in both areas would make sense. This will be in place from April and we expect residents will notice little difference. In the meantime, however, a local tree surgeon has started to pollard the trees in the churchyard and cemetery. This essential work is long overdue and while appearing very drastic it is for the long term well-being and benefit of the trees.



We have decided to keep the annual precept at the same level as last year. This is the money that is raised through the council tax to pay for the work of the parish council. In making our decision we wanted to retain a small but viable fund to cover routine maintenance tasks such as the grass cutting mentioned earlier as well as the occasional special project such as the pollarding. In reality the precept is a small fraction of the overall council tax amount.

Since the last Around Pattishall was published we have decided to go ahead and purchase from BT the public telephone box on Banbury Lane in Cold Higham. Once the purchase has been completed, probably in the next month or so, we will convert the box into a village noticeboard and information point, as mentioned in the last edition.

The annual litter pick will be held on Sunday 11 March. As usual the pick will start at 11am at the telephone boxes in Cold Higham and Grimscote with the aim of clearing as many of the roadside foot paths and verges as possible around the villages. Afterwards we will retire to the Red Lion for a well earned drink or two. Bags and grab sticks will be provided but please bring your own gloves. Sturdy shoes or boots are advisable.

Finally, Northamptonshire Action With Communities in Rural England (ACRE) is encouraging local residents to participate in its new domestic heating oil purchase scheme. ACRE estimates that the saving per litre is typically between five and ten per cent depending on the amount purchased and the time of the year. The idea is simple - if lots of people choose to purchase their heating oil through the scheme, the supplier will offer a discount. 

A New Bus Station for Northampton? Following the recent public exhibition in Northampton where various designs for the relocation of the bus station to the Fish Market were on display a planning
