There is significant subsidence on Mill Lane running from the A5 to Grimscote. There are also numerous pot holes and breaks in the tarmac along the road. We have notified the local and county councils in the hope that they will do something to remedy the problem.

That's how the 'Voices in Harmony' concert was advertised and where an almost sell-out audience enjoyed an evening of local talent performing on stage in an almost club-like atmosphere, with spectacular lighting effects. The evening of popular music from various genres was a great treat for everyone. Firstly 14-year old Josie Richardson with a phenomenal voice, sang several pop songs, followed by the folk duo of Andy Jordan and Val Scrivener, Andy playing solo guitar, too.

During the interval, the two bars did a good trade and tickets for the generous raffle prizes were sold. We then sat back and enjoyed the jazz style of Melinda Lightfoot and her versatile accompanist, who received great ovations following his extemporising. Finally it was a trip down memory lane as John and Kathie Barker entertained us with songs from the shows.

And the purpose of the event? To launch the project to install a much-needed servery and toilet in the church making it a much more useable and attractive parish venue. The evening raised about £2000 and with the generosity of donations made both on the evening and since the fund now stands at about £13,000, nearly half of the total of £30,000.

Thank you to Michael Marketis who masterminded the event, to the performers who gave their time and talents to entertain us, to the generous sponsors of the prizes, to those who were front of house and supervised the lighting and sound, and to all who supported the event by just being there!

Mini Speed Sign

Following three years in partnership with Northamptonshire Police and with the help of a number of willing volunteers from the village we have at last installed two Speed Indicator Units along Butchers/Banbury Lane.

In the past and in many surrounding villages the County Council installed these at their cost or at a highly subsidised rate, unfortunately County Council Budget cuts scuppered this system and so this project had to be self funded.

Your Parish Council recognised the urgency and the need, we have official figures documented by the Police of 17,000+ vehicle movements along Butchers/Banbury Lane in a seven day period of which 70% exceeded the prescribed speed restriction! Unfortunately many of these vehicles were from the Parish.

We have experienced many 'near misses' at the Zebra Crossing with youngsters on their way to school with adults at-hand! We have tried so hard to provide some form of speed control before there is a fatality and that has now been achieved. Please take heed of your speed, in many cases it is your children we are trying to protect!

This was the final outstanding project of the Pattishall Parish Plan Committee. The Plan was published in 2008 with three outstanding items; the re-development of the Parish Hall, the entry to Fosters Booth Road and Speed Control. The Parish Hall redevelopment is now underway shortly and everything else has now been achieved and so in its current form, the Pattishall Parish Plan Management Committee is standing down.

I would like to record my thanks on your behalf to everyone who has helped conclude this project. It was a major task involving the whole community and managed by a few with an excellent conclusion, success.

Parishes are now being encourage to formulate a Neighbourhood Plan, this will be instigated by the Parish Council and more details will be available before the end of the year and this too is likely to involve the whole community.
