

## Nappies that don't cost the earth

Did you know that by the time your baby is potty trained, your little he or she could have used as many as 4000 disposable nappies?! This Real Nappy Week (15-21st April) we are asking parents to think twice about how they use nappies with their babies. Most nappies are made from plastic, which does not rot down; in fact, the first disposable nappies that

were ever used, decades ago, will still be sitting in a landfill site today. A financially and environmentally costly and wasteful habit, you might think!

The UK throws away 3 billion nappies every year. But there is an alternative that is not only good for the environment, but good for your pocket too.

Using 'real' nappies instead of disposables can reduce your baby's impact on the environment by up to 40% and can save you at least £500 over your child's nappywearing period. This also takes into account the costs of extra washing, which comes to a surprisingly small sum of just £1 per week. Real nappies can last for years so you can achieve further savings by using them again as your family grows. Once you're finished with the nappies you could even make some money back by selling them. There are numerous websites for buying and selling second hand real nappies – just run a quick search online.

If you are a Northamptonshire resident, you can borrow a nappy trial kit to try out Real Nappies with your child. Also, when you spend £60 or more on real nappies (new or second hand), Northamptonshire County Council will give you £25 cashback. Call 01604 237440 for more information.

21<sup>st</sup> Century Real Nappies – myths dispelled!

- You don't need to sterilise, scrub or soak them. Liners are used for ease and cleanliness.
- You don't need to boil wash them (40 or 60 degrees is recommended).
- You don't need to fold them. You can still buy traditional Terries squares, but many nappies now are already shaped, much like underpants or disposable nappies.
- There are no pins involved pins have been replaced with Velcro, poppers or plastic grip fastenings.
- Plus, modern nappies come in a variety of different fabrics and fun, colourful designs.

#### Missing and Destroyed Television History

Did you know that out of the 500 or so editions of Top Of The Pops that were produced during its first decade (the 1960s), just 20 of these still exist?

In the 1970s, the BBC and ITV companies systematically cleared their archives and disposed of hundreds of classic television programmes. In the days before VCRs and home recording, these programmes were seen to be of no further use once they had aired, and to make room for more recent (and as they saw it - more lucrative productions) a huge amount of British television heritage was destroyed. Tapes were wiped, and films thrown in rubbish tips.

Top of the Pops is not a unique example. Virtually every show of the 60s and 70s, from The Avengers to Dad's Army and Z Cars has missing instalments, even entirely missing series. Some programmes do not have a single surviving episode!

Extensive searches by dedicated individuals and television enthusiast groups have recovered material which would otherwise remain forever lost. While the programmes no longer sit in television archives, members of the public may have recordings of great interest. Indeed, material has turned up in the most unusual and unexpected of places – car boot sales, schools, lofts and a basement of a Mormon church!

Early video tape recorders, such as the reel-to-reel CV2000 or later cassette formats such as the Philips n1500 or n1700, the Grundig SVR, even Betamax, Video2000, and VHS machines may have well recorded programmes which exist nowhere else except forgotten in a dusty box in someone's loft. Some shows are so absent and mysterious that even audio recordings or photographs taken off screen have provided a rare glimpse into an otherwise entirely missing production.

To mark the 50th anniversary of Doctor Who, the Radio Times have launched their own search for missing examples of the programme, which currently has over 100 episodes missing.

Dedicated television enthusiasts like myself, are always thrilled and delighted to follow any lead or idea, and never feel as if any time has been wasted even if the

material turns out to be known to exist. Also, any original tapes or film would merely be copied – the originals would be returned.

So, do you know anyone with old film in their loft?! It could be a piece of British popular culture history!
