# Master Composters Wanted

Are you interested in volunteering in your local community? Are you passionate about gardening and composting? Then why not volunteer as a Master Composter?

As part of Northamptonshire Waste Partnership, South Northamptonshire Council is looking for people who would like to help spread the message of home composting. The scheme was launched 3 years ago, and the Council is now looking to start another round of recruitment following the scheme's ongoing success.



Master Composters will receive free training, free resources, travel expenses etc, as well as ongoing support from their co-ordinator. In return for this training and support Master Composter volunteers will spend a minimum of 30 hours over a 12-24 month period spreading the composting message in their local community. This could be anything from writing articles for the local newsletter, holding demonstrations at their allotment, or even helping out at the Northants gardening shows.

# Old Age begins at 25!

I've recently been undertaking some pretty serious study on the effects of ageing on the body. The course is intended for postgraduate medical students so it's been icepack-on-the-head stuff but it's given me some fascinating insights. The first is the headline at the top of the page, that biologically speaking, old age starts at 25. It's as if Mother Nature says, once you get into your twenties, "Right that's it – it's downhill all the way now".

And at first sight it can make pretty depressing reading. Muscles deteriorate and adipose tissue (that's FAT to you and me) increases; everything to do with the blood and the heart gets worse, the immune system weakens, as do the bones. Your lungs deteriorate so you can't get as much oxygen as you used to. You feel the cold more, your thirst mechanism gets less efficient so you're in danger of dehydration, the joints become stiffer so you can't move as easily – the list goes on and on. At one point I thought, "Oh just take me to the knackers yard and have done with it."

But then came the really startling thing. None of this HAS to happen. It's not an inevitable process. Over and over again I read the same thing. These deteriorations occur if we stop being active. There can be a huge difference between your actual CHRONOLOGICAL age (for example, 74) and your BIOLOGICAL age, the age your body thinks it is and acts like it is (which could be, for example 45).

And what's the secret? A pill? A drug? No – it's quite simply exercise. With exercise you can slow down these deteriorations and in many cases actually stop them from happening. And what's more, it's possible to reverse them if they've already started (which applies to everybody over 25).

AND I CAN TESTIFY TO IT FROM MY OWN EXPERIENCE. One of our clients, Iris, is 82. She's been coming to us now for six months and when she started she was in a terrible state: she shuffled rather than walked, she couldn't step onto a six inch box without assistance, she had a bad stoop – in fact everything about her said "dithery old lady". That was six months ago. You should see her now. She walks with confidence, can step up and down without assistance – and wait for it – she has been doing some boxing. And one of my senior trainers, Paul, who is responsible for Iris's fitness programme, says she has a vicious right hook!

So to anybody reading this who is over 25 – I have just three words to say to you – DO SOME EXERCISE.

If you have an urgent medical problem you will be able to access a health professional within 24 hours.

Patients who need to be seen urgently will always be seen at the end of either the morning or evening surgeries.

During these hours minor illnesses like stomach upsets or ear infections, or injuries such as sprains, strains, minor burns or wounds can also be treated at the Centre.

#### Triage

Some problems can be resolved over the telephone (triage). The doctor will decide whether an emergency appointment or telephone consultation is appropriate. There is also a facility for nurse triage during morning surgeries.

#### Talking to a Doctor by Telephone

If you wish to speak to a doctor personally, they are usually available at the end of morning surgery. You will be asked to leave a telephone number so that the doctor can call you at a mutually convenient time. Only very urgent calls will be put through to the doctor during surgery hours. If possible, please tell the administrator what the call is about so they can review your notes and assess how urgent the situation is.

# Out-of-hours Doctor and 24-hour access to health information: dial 111

The new way to access out of hours doctors appointments and Health information.

# The adviser will ask you questions to determine the appropriate course of action. They can book out of hours doctors appointments, direct you to A & E or Minor Illnesses/Injuries unit, call an ambulance, or just provide advice over the phone.

#### **Pharmacist**

Qualified pharmacists in your locality can give you expert advice on medicines and how they work.

They can also help you decide whether you need to see a doctor. You don't need an appointment, and can talk to them privately and in confidence.

#### **Accident and Emergency**

Operates 24/7, Northampton General Hospital, Cliftonville

Deals with acute injury or illness, which may or may not be life-threatening.
