Superfast Broadband

As you may have read Superfast Broadband went live in Towcester, Weedon and Paulesbury on 3rd February, two months ahead of schedule. The Pattishall exchange (together with Silverstone) is due to be upgraded in March (and Blakesley with Blisworth in June). It is however probable that not all premises may gain access to Superfast Broadband in the same phase of the project and so may be subject to slightly different solutions and timings.

Superfast broadband is generally defined as having download speeds of at least 20Mbps – and more importantly, these speeds come with no upper limit. This compares with standard ADSL speeds that currently average about 7.6Mpbs (and often much less). The increased download speeds of superfast broadband will translate into faster download times for music, TV streaming as well as playing online video games.

Pattishall Parish Plan 2 Questionnaire

Thank you to everyone who returned a questionnaire.

Responses: 195 (30%)

The response rate - 30% - is lower than 2007 but the survey has provided the basis for Parish Plan 2 (PP2). PP2 will consider the needs and aspirations of the Parish over the next 10 -12 years, including future housing development.

In the short term, views expressed in the questionnaire have been used to support the Parish Council response to the South Northamptonshire Local Plan consultation process, which was submitted at the end of January 2014.

Demographics

The demographic data captured in the questionnaire compares well with the 2011 census data that has been summarised as part of the SNC consultation pack.

- Number of households, November 2013 = 656 (91% Owner Occupied)
- Almost 70% of residents have lived in the Parish for more than 10 years
- 8% of households are currently in need of alternative accommodation

Many respondents were not

aware of the village greens and most thought they were OK at best; few saw the greens as valuable green space. However the vast majority of suggestions were positive and supportive of some level of improvement action.

PP2 Planning Process

The data plus suggestions highlight the following potential actions for PP2:

- Protect our local green spaces from development
- Re-furbish the village greens



- Create a people/dog friendly (by replacing stiles with kissing gates) circular route/linear park linking the three villages
- Encourage involvement/engagement of the wider community
- Identify at least one site per village for limited development. (It is essential that the community has the opportunity to suggest specific sites within PP2 for future growth, rather than allowing piecemeal development to take place)
- Improve access to Parish Hall/Playing Fields with a new pedestrian/disabled walkway from main gate to entrance, re-surface car park and better lighting
- Try to establish a community shop based in one of the pubs
- Make more of historic linkages to shoe industry and site of internment camp

Other Issues

- Speeding still a concern Astcote, School Road, Banbury Lane, A5
- Designated bus stops, bus shelter
- Parking at the school

- Pedestrian crossing at School
- Coffee shop meeting point
- Faster Broadband

Have your voice heard

People who are actively involved in their community are being asked to assist the police and Police and Crime Commissioner on different aspects across the criminal justice system, by becoming an Independent Advisor. Volunteers are sought in Daventry and South Northamptonshire to consider how police policies, practices and procedures might impact them and their peers. Northamptonshire Police and Police and Crime Commissioners are committed to engaging regularly with diverse communities across the county and Independent Advisory Groups (IAGs) provide one of many forums to enable this.

Geoffrey Clayson, a member of the Daventry and South Northamptonshire Independent Advisory Group said: "I was very interested in joining an IAG when I heard about them, mainly because I thought I could make a difference to local policing. I have local knowledge about the area I live in as well as experience as a Parish Councillor."

The bi-monthly meetings bring different people together around a table to discuss important topics. Being a member of an Independent Advisory Group is not just about sitting at a meeting. It is a two-way process where we can raise any concerns each of us might have that are affecting the particular community or area that we represent, and we are also given the opportunity to be a part of new ideas and ways of working by the Force and Police and Crime Commission. There is an opportunity to expand the Independent Advisory Groups and use members more. The police and the Police and Crime Commissioner have an important job to do and volunteers are keen to help to achieve some of the aims that will no doubt impact communities.

Daventry and South Northamptonshire Chief Inspector Tom Thompson said: "We welcome new members to the Daventry and South Northants IAG who will be able to challenge constructively and offer advice to us, especially if they feel that their particular community is not always heard. We are seeking people who have an awareness of cultural needs or specific issues that affect a particular community, for example a rural community, young people, religious group, ethnic group, or experience of working with different groups i.e sex workers or drug users."

Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commissioner Adam Simmonds said: "If you live or work in the county, are interested in what the police are doing in your community, feel you are able to challenge and offer advice to us, then please do get in touch. Together we can improve services across the whole criminal justice system."
