Our long serving staff have a wealth of experience and children settle quickly in the safe, comforting and stimulating environment.

We have had a great year with fundraising events making record amounts. We are a charity run by a committee of volunteers and every penny raised goes to making the

children's time at the Pre school a better experience. As I write we have a visit from the Mini Beast Man with all his lovely creepy crawlies, snakes and spiders, hence the reason I am here writing this and not at Pre School!!

Thank you to everyone who has supported us this year with our fundraising. The Pattishall & District Food & Produce Show Sunday 14th September 2014

This event which was so popular within the parish sadly ended in 1997 but with the resurgence of all things home made & grown it makes a welcome reappearance on Sunday, September 14th at Pattishall Parish Hall. We are delighted that Johnnie Amos, Radio Northampton's gardening expert will be joining us and presenting the prizes. In addition to The Floral Arranging Cup and The Miss Olney Cup for the overall show winner there are new trophies for presention; The Eastcote Arms Cup for the winner of the cookery section, The Horace Bates Cup for the fruit & vegetable section, The Barry Evans Cup for the egg section, The Johns Motors Cup for the handicrafts section and The Gardening Club Cup for flowers & plants.

We also have a most important section for children with cups to be awarded for up to 5 years, 6 to 8 years, 9 to 11 years and 12 to 16 years. We hope that lots of youngsters will enter as well as their parents to make the show a success so it becomes a permanent fixture as a parish event. Previous editions of *Around Pattishall* have highlighted the various classes for adults, whereas this one focuses

on the Children's Section where it is hoped there is something for all, whether under five or in the older age groups. The classes will be judged in the four age categories so there will be four winners for each one. As with the adult classes certificates will also be awarded for second and third places. All entries (child & adult) on the day will be awarded a point with 20 points for first, 15 points for second and 10 points for third, thus the more classes you enter the more points you get.

Davidsons Proposed Development Parish Plan 2

Over 20 people attended the June Parish Council Meeting concerning the development of land off Fosters Booth Road.

There had been a 200 signature letter sent to SNC objecting to the proposed development on numerous grounds, a copy of which was presented to the Parish Council.

Three parish councillors had attended a pre-planning meeting with Davidsons and the SNC planning officer who will handle the case. We outlined our concerns as to the size of the development and how it did not fit in with our proposed Parish Plan.

We explained the council's thoughts for the future expansion of the parish should be shared between the three settlements of Astcote, Eastcote and Pattishall.

When we hear from SNC concerning the number of houses required for the parish, we will have to expand the village envelopes (which have been the same for about 40 years) to accept the new housing requirements.

We expect to have the proposed plan, showing the amendments to the parish boundaries, available in the autumn for consultation.

We set out in 2008 to refurbish and extend the hall in line with your comments from the Parish Plan and this month has seen the completion of the major part of this project. Six years of fundraising through grants and community efforts have resulted in well over £200,000 worth of building works and refurbishment. The Development Sub-Committee and Parish Hall Committee hope that we have achieved the objective of bringing the hall into the 21st century enabling it to continue to be a centre for the community.



Enormous thanks are due to Paul Berry who has voluntarily project managed the work from the beginning. We are grateful to all those volunteers who assisted in tasks such as moving equipment, dismantling the kitchen, de-cluttering the loft, painting, putting up shelving and cleaning throughout the period as well as the hall users who carried on as usual around the building work.

Perhaps a commendation is that we are a finalist in a national award by Biffa for a community project, an achievement even if we are not successful. We haven't finished and we shall be starting on the next phase to improve the large hall and car park, a major task.

The Car Boots will be starting in the summer, please see the notice, great fun for buyers and sellers; you never know what treasures you might find!

Grimscote Mill

I was born in Grimscote Mill in December 1950. There was already deep snow on the ground and a blizzard had blown up in the early morning. My father cycled home after a night shift at Timkens in Duston to find my mother in the throes of labour. My aunt had stayed overnight, to help with my brothers as Mum was close to confinement. She had left for work (on the bus to Northampton) about an hour before Dad arrived back. Almost as soon as he got through the door, he was back on his bike, in the appalling weather, to ring for the local midwife, Nurse Edwards, who lived in Gayton. The nearest telephone was Fosters Booth.

My memories of the Mill are sketchy. However, my two older brothers remember it well and my mother spoke of it often. She had fond memories, as it was her and Dad's first home together after the upheaval of WW2.

Mum was a Londoner and their family home had been flattened by a doodlebug. Dad was born in Byfield, and although his family came from Warwickshire, he had found himself based in Northampton after his mother remarried in the late 20s. His father, my grandfather, had died in 1919 as a result of injuries sustained in the Great War.

The Mill was basic, but fairly typical of its time. It was also fairly isolated, even now – being a bit of a walk from Grimscote itself and in a deep valley.

The Mill was rented from Farmer Ellis. My uncle had heard that it needed tenants and passed on this nugget to my parents who were keen to have somewhere to call their own, having lived for the first few years of married life with one or other set of parents.

There was no electricity, nor running water – well, not inside anyway. Water was retrieved from under the kitchen floor via a trap door. This was fed by the mill stream itself and was boiled to make it safe. Lighting was given by paraffin lamps or candles, and heating via open fires. There was no bathroom and only a range for cooking.

The lavatory was out in the orchard. It had to be emptied into a hole in the ground; but not always the same hole! These depositories were dug by my father. Sadly, the loo was under a plum tree which made it fairly hazardous to attend in the summer months because of the quantity of wasps around.

The only other 'deprivation' was the nightly appearance of mice running round the top of wainscoting, from whence they would leap onto the dining table.

The house itself is a mystery to all of us. Young children only remember the extraordinary and the fun!

So, we relished the joy that came in the warmer months when the garden and countryside came into their own and we could spend hours outside.

The Mill was surrounded by gardens and orchards – apples, plums and a very fine espalier pear tree and had a good sized vegetable plot that my father tended.

Along with the mill stream, there was also a brook that ran through the garden and produced watercress in the better months, but one had to be careful to cook it or wash it thoroughly to avoid ingesting liver fluke

The mill wheel was still intact and housed in the barn, both my brothers remember being frightened by the constant roar of water – but it was a fascination to little people and featured as a 'dragon' in various forms and stories.

My eldest brother remembers helping my father to collect nettles, which were used for food, and to snare rabbits – both of which enhanced the meagre produce available during rationing. One of his daily jobs was collecting wood for the fires; he was only 4 or 5 at the time and not yet at school. He also remembers helping Mum to take lunch and drinks to tree fellers in Grimscote – one has to assume that this increased the log store for winter as well as providing some building materials.

The Mill was a naturalist's heaven, an oasis of calm after a very great storm, and only ever produced happy memories for my family. We weren't there long, in the scheme of things, maybe 3 years but it left an indelible memory of peace and tranquillity.

One could almost say it was our 'Darling Buds of May' moment.

Our next move was into the parish proper and Festival Road. Although my grandparents had bought a house in Eastcote in 1946, my family didn't actually 'hit' Pattishall until the early 50s.

My memory comes into its own now – with the earliest being watching the Coronation on my grandparent's TV. I was two and a half.

Greens Norton Patients Participation Panel

As you may be aware, the proposed Towcester Vale Development has provision for an enhanced medical facility.

The precise nature of this facility is still very much at the concept/planning stage, however it seems likely that it could include a practice surgery together with its own pharmacy.

Also there may be consultant rooms available to enable consultants and doctors with particular specialities to hold regular consultation clinics, thus reducing the need for visits to Northampton or Daventry.

The impetus is very much on now, with the local council and Member of Parliament commited to driving this proposal forward for the benefit of the community.

To give the Commissioning Group some idea of the services that the public felt should be incorporated into the project, the GNPPP carried out a survey within the Weedon, Greens Norton and Towcester Practices suggesting 10 possible areas which may be of benefit if included.

As the size and range of the facility has still to be decided, details of the top 3 services in order of perceived importance have been forwarded to our M.P. and the commissioning group for serious consideration for incorporation into the facility. These are:

- 1st Urgent Care Centre. For intermediate care pre-hospital, preventing admission.
- 2nd Out Patient Services. Where Consultants (together with GPs) could consult in areas such as ophthalmology, ENT, dermatology, gynae, elderly medicine and diabetes.

3rd Short Term Beds. For Emergency Admissions, where appropriate to prevent admissions to NGH ,while other services are being arranged. Short term only.

If you want to keep abreast of this development and other items of interest, why not become an Associate Member of GNPPP? This means that you will receive minutes of the meetings, and upon invitation, could attend a meeting to see what happens.



Bus Service

The new North Gate Bus Station in Northampton is now open. Our number 87 bus arrives and departs from Stand 16 on the Market

Square side of the Drapery. There are still some teething problems to be sorted out. It is hoped that a waiting room will be provided in one of the shop units on the Drapery.
