Poors Allotment Charity, Cold Higham/Grimscote

Each year the Trustees of the above charity are able to 'apply the income of the Charity in relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the parish of Cold Higham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress, by making grants

of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons'.

In practice this means that funds may be available for:

- Households with at least one householder being aged 65 or over for heating purposes
- 2. Young people or students in higher education needing to purchase books or tools or to pay for travelling expenses
- 3. Any other person in need or distress at any time of the year

Pattishall Picnic in the Park Music Festival Saturday 12th July



Wow! What a time was had by all at Pattishall Parish's first ever music festival! It was a marvellous fun soaked time any which way you look at it. The day dawned hot and sunny, perfect for an outdoor music event. The union flag and cheerful bunting blew in the gentle breeze. The professional covered stage and music system waiting expectantly to burst into life.

After a morning of hustle and bustle final preparations were in place as ticket sellers and checkers took their places at the gates. Being new to this I had brought a couple of fold up chairs and a cool box with a few cans and nibbles in ready to sit back and enjoy the music when my stint at the gate was done. How meagre my preparations seemed when people started to arrive. They were loaded down like pack horses, carrying gazebos, tables, chairs, and enough food and drink for a royal banquet lasting several days! I realised I had a lot to learn about how to enjoy this sort of event in style.

Band members started to arrive and Roadhouse kicked off the event with country music we all know from the likes of Johnny Cash and Dolly Parton. The afternoon



rolled on with great singing from teenager Jossi Richardson, Irish and folk music and fiddle playing from The Barn Rat Band, and contemporary jazz from 5th Floor. Amber Climate, featuring Pattishall resident Nigel Banister on drums, gave us original material with a blend of rock and acoustic. I see Nigel in a whole new light now, up on the stage doing what he loves, and what a talent.

As afternoon rolled into evening I looked behind me to see the skyline filled with gazebos on the bank, blankets on the ground, people lying around eating, drinking,

chatting and singing. The smell of delicious pork rolls filled the air; there were queues at the bar for beer and Pimm's, children laughing on the play equipment, and money changing hands at the craft stalls in the hall. Wonderful to see Pattishall Parish relaxing on this special summer's day.

As evening arrived the music continued with the Goat Roper Rodeo Band who have a style all their own.



Their music is gritty country blues with a difference and as people started to draw nearer to the stage it was clearly going down well. Joe Miles and his band gave us a treat with their own style of jazz and modern. Joe is a young, tall, striking guy whose loud clear voice sounded like liquid gold. He knows what he wants and spent time getting the sound levels adjusted before he began his set and boy was it worth it. What a talent. Musical talent sure runs in that family — Joe is the grandson of the late British jazz legend Terry Lightfoot, and son of great jazz singer, and local resident, Melinda Lightfoot.

As dark descended it was time for the grand finale and Just Nuisance gave us a finale to remember. People had now moved down from the bank and were determined to soak up every last second of music and atmosphere. A light drizzle added to the buzz as bods started dancing and bopping around near the stage to the great rock covers from the band Just Nuisance. They really did rock the place with songs from The Who, Led Zeppelin, Thin Lizzy and many more. What a way to end the show. They provided us with a fitting climax to a day full of great music and talented performers. Again, wow!

A massive thank you goes to the music festival committee, to Johnny Smith who came up with the idea, and worked tirelessly to make it come about; to Nigel Banister, whose experience and contacts in the music world were invaluable, and to the great work, time and effort put in by the rest of the committee, Iris Illingworth, Josie Bateman, Jon Hibbert, and I did a little bit, but really only a little, Suzanne Raper. Big thanks too, to Neil Malpas and members of the Hyodokan Karate & Self-Defence Club for providing security, also to Pre-School for the food, FOPS for the Pimms, and to everyone one else who donated equipment, money, and all the



volunteers on the day, that helped make the music festival such a success. And thank you to you, all the people who turned up to support this first time event and create such a great atmosphere. Shall we do one next year?

By ten the Parish Hall was full of wonderful exhibits, awaiting the seven judges, who in turn were most diligent in their deliberations and were impressed by the standard of the entries. But spare a thought for the judge of the most disgusting but edible sandwich, which was not only marked on visual presentation but also on taste! It was intended that doors would open to the public at noon but owing to the number and the quality of the entries the doors to the hall did not open until nearly 1 o'clock. Eager entrants flooded in, gasps of delight followed, laughter and chatter filled the hall and

everybody became a self appointed judge as they walked round the laden tables.

The *Produce Cafe* was busy selling burgers, cakes and endless cups of tea with all proceeds going to help the Show, along with The Bouncy Castle and the raffle so thank you to Chris, Sarah and Merilyn respectively, and to all who helped to make the Produce Show such an enjoyable success. There were several stands supporting the show selling tasty treats, jewellery, clothes and cards, cheese, books and beautiful works of art. We were also pleased to welcome a stand promoting the Towcester Museum, also run by volunteers like ourselves, and well worth a visit.

Johnnie Amos, Radio Northampton's Gardening Expert kindly awarded the prizes and to reiterate his own words: "All are winners as the display of the entries is a



great testament to the talent and enthusiasm of those who live in the parish."

Festival Road - Reminiscences

We moved from the idyllic setting of Grimscote Mill to Festival Road in early 1952.

Newly built, we were the first tenants. We had electricity, plumbing, sewerage, a kitchen that worked from switches, an indoor toilet and bathroom – all a delight for my Mother.

The downside was metal windows and doors, tiled windowsills and concrete floors – magnets for condensation. The eaves were another matter – driving rain or snow all parked up in the loft.

A home with four bedrooms, bathroom, kitchen, 'parlour' and big through room where most of life took place. There was a little verandah at the back and two outside rooms, accessed through the kitchen door. One was a coal store and the other where my father kept his ferrets.

The front garden was compact. The back was much bigger, designed for growing vegetables to augment the family table, triangular in shape with a path to the right. We kept a few chickens.

The estate was still under construction. Leys Road was almost complete but Festival was still a building site. Leys Road extended to the alley next to the cemetery and the other side stopped at the corn field that bounded the back of all the houses in Festival. Houses on Fosters Booth Road completed the estate. There was not much else except the 'big house' opposite the 'Old Nick', the Chapel and a small terrace below, plus the 'bus depot'.

Pattishall was a small community, with most of the original village in Church Street and The Crescent, next to the Church.

There were a lot of cottages; some in small courtyards with their own water pump. There was one where the old school stood (now occupied by the Remembrance Garden), another by what was the Post Office. There was a row of tiny stone cottages between the Green and the Malt Shovel, one of which used to sell Wade figures - and another row of cottages that went to make way for the council housing in The Crescent.

In an effort to make England 'fit for heroes', much of our village was deemed uninhabitable, demolished and replaced by the 'Council'.

From here we next went to Eastcote, with the purchase of two lovely cottages but back to outside loos!

Always call 999 if someone is seriously ill or injured, and their life is at risk.

If you have an urgent medical problem you will be able to access a health professional within 24 hours

Patients who need to be seen urgently will always be seen at the end of either the morning or evening surgeries.

During these hours minor illnesses like stomach upsets or ear infections, or injuries such as sprains, strains, minor burns or wounds can also be treated at the Centre.

Triage

Some problems can be resolved over the telephone (triage). The doctor will decide whether an emergency appointment or telephone consultation is appropriate. There is also a facility for nurse triage during morning surgeries.

Talking to a Doctor by Telephone

If you wish to speak to a doctor personally, they are usually available at the end of morning surgery. You will be asked to leave a telephone number so that the doctor can call you at a mutually convenient time. Only very urgent calls will be put through to the doctor during surgery hours. If possible, please tell the administrator what the call is about so they can review your notes and assess how urgent the situation is.

Out-of-hours Doctor and 24-hour access to health information: dial 111

The new way to access out of hours doctors appointments and Health information.

The adviser will ask you questions to determine the appropriate course of action. They can book out of hours doctors appointments, direct you to A & E or Minor Illnesses/Injuries unit, call an ambulance, or just provide advice over the phone.

Pharmacist

Qualified pharmacists in your locality can give you expert advice on medicines and how they work.

They can also help you decide whether you need to see a doctor. You don't need an appointment, and can talk to them privately and in confidence.

Accident and Emergency

Operates 24/7, Northampton General Hospital, Cliftonville

Deals with acute injury or illness, which may or may not be life-threatening.


