Cold Higham Parish Council

Now that Spring is here we were lucky enough to enjoy a fine day for the annual litter pick which was well attended, meeting in Cold Higham and Grimscote. Around 15-20 sacks of litter were collected in the parish, with a significant amount being retrieved between Potcote and the Foxley crossroads. Thank you to all those who joined in with the litter pick, both on the day and on the days before and after. It was a great opportunity to catch up with everyone.

We have some great news in that the War Memorial Committee have successfully been awarded a grant to repair the War Memorial in Cold Higham Churchyard. Congratulations to all involved. Do take a look at the article 'Cold Higham War Memorial Project' for more details.

Dog fouling is an issue yet again. It has been noted that some people are not cleaning up after their dogs. It is the dog walker's responsibility to bag it and bin it. Failure to do so can result in a fine of up to £1,000. Not only is dog fouling unpleasant, it can also lead to abortion in livestock and has serious health implications for humans. Toxocariosis can lead to blindness and is preventable. Not only is this an issue in the villages and surrounding countryside, it is also an issue in the Cemetery at Cold Higham. This is not acceptable and can cause distress to people visiting the graveyard.

The Parish Council have been continuing their work to improve the safety of the A5 junctions at both Banbury Lane and Mill Lane. Work is due to start this April which will involve cutting back vegetation, improving both the visibility and safety of these junctions. We are still pressing for a continued maintenance programme to ensure ground vegetation is kept at an acceptable and safe level.

After some 35 years of excellent service, Pauline Pearson is retiring this month as Clerk to the Parish Council. Her length of service is more than admirable, especially considering the fact that she had originally offered to help on a temporary basis. I would like to take this opportunity to thank her on behalf of all the members of the Parish Council for all her hard work over the years and I'm sure every Cold Higham Parish Councillor both past and present would like to join me in wishing her well for the future. Pauline's last meeting is on the 22nd April.

Cold Higham War Memorial

In the last Around Pattishall we wrote about the establishment of a Working Group, under the aegis of the Cold Higham Parish Council, to arrange for the repair of the damaged War Memorial in St Luke's churchyard. We also referred to our other work, researching the names of those commemorated on the Memorial. We can now report significant progress.



We are delighted that South Northants Council has approved our application for a grant to repair the Memorial. The attached pictures show how much that repair is needed. The grant will enable us to get a contract for the cross to be mended, placed on a new column and then secured back on the base, which will be reseated and levelled. The small plaque on the base with the two WW2 names will be renewed, and the whole memorial will be cleaned. We have also made provision for a regime of long term on-going inspection and maintenance.



The timing of the repair is not yet certain, but we will update the website page (coldhigham.org.uk/category/war-memorial-news/) with further information as we make progress.

The Working Group has made great strides in researching some of the names of those who died, and some families have made contact with us which is very much appreciated. We would still like more information please – photos, anecdotes, memorabilia etc. All the names are on the web site (see <u>coldhigham.org.uk/war-memorial-2/</u>). We are making plans to make the results of this research public in time.

The Pattishall & District Produce Show Sunday 13th September 2015

Although the Pattishall & District Produce Show was revived after a lapse of seventeen years, it was back in1864 when the parish saw its first show. Here follows an account published by The Northampton Mercury on 10th August 1867.

The third annual exhibition of the Pattishall Flower Society took place on Wednesday last. The tent belonging to the Northamptonshire Archerv Societv was erected in a field in the village and in it were displayed the various productions. In another part of the field a tent was also erected, and in which refreshments were served, the profits being devoted to the fund for the restoration of the church. A general Post office, under the management of Mrs Groves, was also established, and did a fair amount of business, the proceeds of this also being for the church fund. The productions in the tent were very fine. Side by side with monster lettuces and cabbages were fine potatoes and turnips and the fruit was equally as fine. The two centre tables were full of fine greenhouse plants, kindly sent for decoration by Lady Arabella Hesketh, of Easton Neston, and by T, Ridgway, Esg. of Elm Lodge, Towcester. Mr Slarke, gardener to Lady Hesketh, also exhibited a collection of fruit, tastefully arranged in a box, with moss for the fruit to lie upon. Another collection of fruit, exhibited by Mr. Grove, attracted considerable attention, and called forth many remarks, the melon having the following couplet embodying an unquestionable truth placed upon it:-

"Like melons, friends are to be found in plenty, Of which not even one is good in twenty."

The 2015 Produce Show will be held in the Parish Hall on Sunday 13th September. A full schedule of classes for children, cookery, handicrafts, arts & crafts, photography plus fruit, flowers and vegetables will be published along with the July edition of Around Pattishall. The March edition of Around Pattishall listed the fruit, vegetables, flowers & plants classes so that gardeners could get planting ready for the show. GNPPP: Let's Hear It For The Girls!

I read recently that, in Bradford, some 200+ Medical Receptionists are being sent on courses to improve their manner of dealing with patients. Fortunately, I don't think that our reception personnel at The Greens Norton Medical Centre are in need of such guidance.

In the theatre and restaurant trades it's known as "Front of House". A hugely important function in any business. On the telephone, or face to face at the Surgery, the receptionists, and the Dispensery staff are the first point of contact within the Surgery for the public. How they deal with the people and enquiries will determine how the service is initially perceived in the mind of the patient.

Dealing with people who may be ill, worried, concerned or just impatient and finding out their problem and then finding the best and most effective route through the practice resources takes skill and patience. Then all of the excellent resources within the practice fall into place, doctors, nurses management and admin functions all operating to high quality.

It was only recently that I realised that with the exception of the two male GPs the practice is run entirely by female staff. I am sure that the two males working within the sorority won't mind me repeating, "Lets Hear It For The Girls!"

Medical Exemption

Some patients with serious long term conditions may qualify for free NHS prescriptions. This usually applies to patients requiring long term prescribed medications and/or dressings. A Medical Exemption certificate is valid for 5 years, and application form FP92A is available at your dispensary or pharmacy.

A more detailed outline of the medical conditions covered by this exemption is published in the Greens Norton Medical Centre Autumn Newsletter which is available on the Centre website, or copies of which are obtainable from the practice.
