Cold Higham Parish Council

Cold Higham commemorated Remembrance Sunday with a great sense of pride this year, with a newly renovated War Memorial. There was a very well attended church service, with family members of the fallen acknowledged on the Memorial attending the service. Afterwards, there was an exhibition about the lives of the people commemorated and this was extremely interesting. Many thanks to Digby Carter for championing this project, gaining the funding required and spearheading a team that has meticulously researched the history of each individual named on the memorial. Do read Digby's article in this publication for more detail.

Some work has been carried out on the A5 in order to address the visibility issues but further work is still required in order to meet our expectations on this. As part of our ongoing discussion with the relevant departments, we would like to hear about your experiences on the A5 in order to add weight to our arguments regarding the T Junction at Mill Lane on the A5 and the staggered crossroads at Banbury Lane and Fosters Booth on the A5. Once again, dog fouling is still an issue, particularly in Grimscote where someone has been collecting the dog poo in bags and then throwing the bags into or over hedges. The Parish Council will monitor the situation and take the strongest action against this unacceptable behaviour and we would like to ask again for dog owners to act responsibly when exercising their dogs.

Pattishall Parish Council

The council meets at 7:45 in the Parish Hall on the second Thursday of each month throughout the year, except for August when there is no meeting scheduled. An agenda and draft minutes are available on the Pattishall Parish website (pattishallparish.org.uk) and all notice boards. Parishioners are very welcome to attend, or contact one of the councillors listed below should they wish to raise a point but cannot be at the meeting in person.

At the last meeting held on November 12th a resident living close to Butchers Lane raised concerns about the speeding traffic along this road. Several options for

calming these speeding motorists were considered and it was decided that a police presence acted as the best deterrent and reminded road users of the speed restriction. It was agreed to request that the police have a more regular presence along Butchers Lane and that residents get involved in a community speed watch. Anyone within the parish who can help by sparing a couple of hours with a community speed watch camera should contact Clare on Clare.Bryan@icaew.com. Motorists are also asked to be vigilant when travelling through the parish at night as some of our younger residents, dressed in dark clothing have been found to be playing "chicken" in the middle of the road in front of oncoming vehicles.

We are concerned, like many residents, of the failure of EON to rectify the many street light problems that exist, although they have been contacted by our parish clerk. A strongly worded letter is on its way to EON and if we do not receive a satisfactory response it may be necessary to engage another provider. The continuing problem with the hedges of The Old Burial Ground in Pattishall was noted and work to address this is due to start before the end of November.

Along with this piece there is an update of the Parish Plan 2. The major change being that there will be no changes to the parish confines (boundaries) until 2017. It was thought unnecessary to have more consultation days but The Parish Plan 2 committee have decided to meet again before submitting our plan to SNC and it is intended that members of the parish are welcome to join them. Please look at the Pattishall Parish website for date, time & venue.

As part of our duties as parish councillors we do monthly safety inspections of the playgrounds at Booth Close, Butchers Lane & School Road. Cold Higham War Memorial Project

The War Memorial was repaired by Boden & Ward on 18th September, and is now fully restored and cleaned.

On Remembrance Sunday (8th November) Rev Marion Reynolds led a memorial service at St Luke's Church. This included re-dedicating the War Memorial itself, and local parishioners were joined by many members of the families of the Honoured Dead in laying wreaths and crosses at the Memorial. The Parish Council wreath was laid by 97 year old Norman Folwell, the brother of Harvey Folwell who is one of those remembered on the Memorial. The Roll of Honour was read by another family member, Lesley Ball.

The service was followed by a short reception in the village hall where a small display had been prepared in honour of all those from Cold Higham Parish who fell in the two World Wars.

Many thanks are due to those who have helped to bring about a successful conclusion to this venture. Most particularly they are due to South Northants Council, for providing the grant which enabled the memorial to be repaired. We are also most grateful to the family members who have contacted us, giving information and artefacts about their relatives. It was a great boost to the organisers that so many family members (around 40) attended the service and exhibition.

With the Memorial now repaired, our attention will focus on continuing the research into the lives of those who died, but also into those who went to war and returned.

We are also considering ways in which parishioners can have access to information about those who fought, on a more permanent basis.

Parish Plan 2

Update December 2015



Timetable

Following a meeting on 26 October, with the Planning department at South Northants Council (SNC), we are now able to confirm the timetable for the next stages of the Local Plan process.

The original time frame to produce and approve the SNC Local Plan has been extended and it is unlikely to be adopted before mid-year 2017.

Next steps

The next key event is another round of consultation during the first quarter of 2016. This community consultation with the 90 Parishes in SNC area will also be open to any resident, landowner or business that wishes to contribute. SNC will include in this consultation any land or proposed development that they have been made aware of.

Parishes will have the opportunity to respond to the consultation process and may need to consult locally to prepare their input. Parishes like Pattishall, who have already developed a parish plan, will use it to inform their response and recommendations to the Local Plan.

The dates for the consultation have yet to be established, but will be published on the SNC website in due course. Once all the recommendations and submissions have been received by the due date, SNC will complete a review and assessment progressing towards the formal adoption of the Local Plan in 2017.

Village Confines

SNC will revisit Village Confines as part of the Local Plan process. Where Parishes submit recommendations these will be tested, reworked if required, and then adopted into the Local Plan. In the absence of recommendations SNC will complete its own review and amend the confines, as they deem appropriate.

The current Village Confine principles will remain as the guideline for the reviews:

- Existing main built up area
- Gardens do not necessarily fall within the confines
- Use natural boundaries, roads/hedges where possible
- Dalscote and Cornhill are Hamlets defined as open countryside
- Land between the villages defined as open countryside
- No residential development in open countryside outside the confines other than:
 - ❑ Buildings essential for the purpose of agriculture or forestry use
 - ❑ Replacement of an existing dwelling (same footprint)

Planning Applications

Any planning applications submitted over the next one to two years will be processed subject to current planning protocol and will not take into account any proposed changes in the Local Plan. For example, existing village confines will apply; only in exceptional circumstances, with full community support, would an application be considered if outside existing or within proposed confines. This is unlikely to be the case for Pattishall Parish.

Village Design Statements

Another feature of the Local Plan process is the option to revise the current Village Design Statements (VDS), which have not been updated since first published many years ago.

A VDS will provide a clear statement of the character of a particular village against which planning applications may be assessed. A VDS is not concerned with whether development should take place but with how planned development should be carried out, so that it is in harmony with its setting and contributes to the conservation and, where possible, enhancement of the local environment.

SNC will accept recommendations for revised VDS from Parish Councils provided that they are supported by evidence of consultation with the community for which they apply. Such recommendations will be tested by SNC and may be adopted as a Supplementary Planning Document within the Local Plan, becoming material to future planning applications.

Pattishall Parish will include revised VDS for Astcote, Eastcote and Pattishall when responding to the consultation process in 2016.

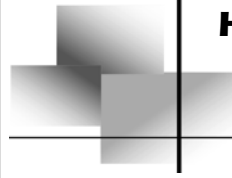
