Picnic in the Park Music Festival 2016 Saturday 2 July

Wow, have we got some exciting additions to Picnic in the Park this year. You do not want to miss it I promise you. And that is not counting the line up of amazing music! Talking of the music check out the band line up and bios on the festival website and in the next edition of Around Pattishall. Wide range again this year including pop and rock covers, trad jazz, brass band, ska, pedrock, Irish and barn dance, original and folk.



The set up of the professional stage, lighting and speakers is being reconfigured and will be even more impressive and amazing than last time. This year the second stage is part of the main stage being directly in front of it, so you will be able to see all those second stage acts clearly. It won't affect the main stage - trust me, it is all clever stuff.

Exciting developments include the building of a patio area immediately at the back of the Large Hall as soon as weather permits, which will also allow easier and smoother disabled access to the Hall. At the music festival this patio will be the **afternoon café** serving tea and cake, etc. But in the evening it will transform into a "**pop up**" fine dining Indian restaurant courtesy of the Royal India, with proper crockery, cutlery and everything! You will be able to book a table, enjoy gourmet Indian cuisine with waiter service, in comfort, while taking in the sights and sounds of the music festival. What a fabulous experience! There will be other food and drink of course. A New Rector for the Amelcote Benefice

Most of you will wonder 'What on Earth is the Amelcote Benefice?' and 'I didn't know we had a new Rector instead of Revd. Marion!'

Nothing has changed, except the names!

It was proposed a couple of years ago that the parishes of Pattishall with Cold Higham and Gayton with Tiffield should have a more snappy title! The name 'Cote' was suggested, as there are several in the benefice and it is the name of the local electoral ward. Then the word 'Amel' was added at it was an early English word for 'Holy '. This was approved by the parishioners at all the churches and by the Bishop of our Diocese. So the title is now official.

Rev Marion Reynolds was appointed Honorary Priest in Charge of the Benefice four years ago but on Palm Sunday this year she was formally installed and instituted as Rector, at Cold Higham Church.

Bishop John Holbrooke, Bishop of Brixworth, Ven. Richard Ormston, Archdeacon of Northampton and Richard Yates, Lay Chairman of the Towcester Deanery officiated, and Revd. Marion was welcomed by the enthusiastic congregation of about 80. A special 'pop-up' choir, directed by Jonathan Stuart led the congregation in the hymns, and also sang two beautiful short anthems. Whilst general celebrations were being held in Cold Higham Village Hall – excellent 'nibbles' and suitable liquid refreshment, the local bell ringers helped round off the morning with a congratulatory 'quarter peal' (40 minutes non-stop ringing).

We all wish Revd. Marion well as she continues her unstinting work amongst us, albeit continuing on a part-time honorary basis.

On 1st Mar 16 we received the following notification from Historic England:

I am writing to inform you that the above war memorial has been added to the List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest. The memorial is now listed at Grade II.

Listing does not prevent the management and maintenance of the Memorial nor does it prevent changes or alter the ownership. Listing does mean that listed building consent has to be applied for in order to make any changes to the structure, which might affect its special interest. We believe it affords an appropriate level of recognition to the Memorial, especially at this centenary time of WW1.

Allotments

The Council have received three applications for allotments and after some clearance of briars, debris and weeds by Robert Hawtin allotments are now available. Please contact the parish clerk or a member of the council should you be interested in a plot. The present cost being £15 or £7:50 for half a plot.

Items from March PC Meeting

The Pool Close notice board will be replaced in due course and we are pleased that broadband has been upgraded; note the green metal boxes around the parish.

Street lighting still causes concern as another defunct light has been reported on Birds Hill. The clerk has yet to receive a response from EON so is now actively pursuing Aylesbury Mains as an alternate supplier.

The Red Lion

The Red Lion at Fosters Booth has been the focus of concern for many residents and at the last meeting it became apparent that an application to list the building as a community asset had only recently been submitted. Although the council believed it had been listed some time ago, along with other assets within the parish, it became clear that an unfortunate error had occurred. The council can only apologise to parishioners for this oversight and is keen to see the Red Lion remain as a building of interest and hopefully reopen as a going concern.

The planning application for five dwellings has been withdrawn. However, it is likely that the application may be modified and resubmitted. In the meantime we have had confirmation that the Red Lion is now listed as a community asset.

South Northamptonshire Local Plan

South Northamptonshire Council (SNC) is now consulting on the Local Plan Part 2A. Individuals and other interested parties are invited to submit responses on their own behalf. For further information on how to get involved in the consultation, please see separate announcement on page 22 of this edition of Around Pattishall.

The Parish Council will be responding to the consultation, which closes on 10 June. Our response will be based on the on-going work to prepare the Parish Plan and provide input on many topics, including possible changes to the village confines required to accommodate up to 45 new dwellings within the Parish by 2029. To inform this response and offer residents opportunity to give feedback before it is submitted to SNC, two open meetings are planned for:

> Thursday 19th May 7:30 – 9:00pm Thursday 26th May 7:30 – 9:00pm

Many of you will be aware that over the Easter period there has been a planning application for 24 dwellings off Fosters Booth Road. Although the council were aware of this potential development the application was unexpected as the possible changes to the confines have not been finalised and remain subject to consultation. The application cannot be supported at this time.



Have Your Say on the Development of Your Area





As South Northamptonshire Council continues its work on the Local Plan Part 2A and begins consulting on its Options consultation, now is your opportunity to help shape the future of the district over the next 15 years.

In December 2014 the Council adopted the West Northants Joint Core Strategy (WNJCS).

This overarching document, drafted in conjunction with Daventry District Council and Northampton Borough Council, sets out the vision, objectives and strategic polices for delivering growth for the district.

The Council is now consulting on the Local Plan Part 2A which provides detail to the framework provided by the WNJCS.

This next level of planning policy is complex and detailed and consultations will be broken to down to focus on specific areas.

But ultimately the Local Plan Part 2A will include policies and proposals to:

determine appropriate levels of growth at the local level

allocate land for specific uses, including housing, employment, retail and leisure uses to ensure we have a healthy supply of developable land;

establish a rural settlement hierarchy to support retention and provision of local services and facilities

designate areas of land that are important and should be protected; such as local green spaces, important landscapes, wildlife sites and historic assets.

The current consultation focuses on options for:

the scale and type of housing development at Parish and Settlement level the location on new employment sites policies on town centres and economic development community/leisure development environmental designations; including green spaces and special landscape areas policies required to manage development in a sustainable way

How to get involved:

Pattishall Parish Council will be holding two open meetings in the Parish Hall on:

Thursday 19th May 7:30 – 9:00pm Thursday 26th May 7:30 – 9:00pm

Individuals and other interested parties are invited to submit responses on their own behalf. However, the Parish Council will be completing the questionnaire; the open meetings will give residents the opportunity to learn more about the consultation process and give feedback before the Parish Council response is submitted to SNC.

Notice to Dog Walkers Cold Higham Parish Council

Dog walking is enjoyable for both dogs and their walkers and should be encouraged. It is important for dog walkers to take responsibility for the behaviour of their dogs not only by cleaning up after them but also to keep them under control for the sake of other walkers, livestock, and wildlife.

Cold Higham Parish Council have received complaints from landowners that some dog walkers are failing to clean up after their dogs and in particular on rights-of-way just off Banbury Lane and in the open countryside. Some dog walkers are also lifting fences to allow their dogs through – doing this regularly reduces the effectiveness of the fence allowing lambs through for example. Failing to clean up after your dog is not only irresponsible but can also be dangerous to livestock and small children.

The following parasites can be present in dog faeces;

Toxocariasis which can cause blindness in young children.

Neosporosis can cause abortions and stillbirth in cattle. It is also dangerous to dogs causing illness in adult dogs and death to puppies. No treatment is available and faeces can remain infectious for up to 6 months.

Sarcocystosis causes neurological disease and death in sheep.

Due to the length of time that the faeces may be infected, picking up after your dog is also important in fields where livestock may not be present as any forage made into hay containing faeces could affect livestock to which it is fed.

Dog walkers should take care when crossing fields containing livestock. Dogs should be kept under close control preferably on a short lead. Cattle can be inquisitive and may come close to investigate. If you feel threatened walk calmly to the field boundary and let your dog go to allow it to run to safety.

It is also important to note that walkers and their dogs are only permitted on the path of the right-of-way, there is no right to venture off the path. It is particularly important at this time of year in areas where there may be lambs and or nesting birds around.
