
# Mobile Library Service

# Pattishall Parish Hall Association Pattishall Playing Field Association

On the 16<sup>th</sup> September 1947 the first committee was formed to run a village hall in Pattishall Parish. The hut next to the school was the original venue for the hall where dances and many other social events were held. One entry in the archives includes a draw for a pair of stockings and 50 cigarettes, tickets at tuppence a sign of the times after the war years with rationing in place.

Over these past 70 years many residents have freely given their time to serve on the committee or assist at events. This has maintained the vibrant community asset we have today.

A replica of the tallest sunflower ever recorded was then stretched out across the room to the delight of the children who couldn't believe how tall it had grown.

# Cold Higham Art Exhibition 30<sup>th</sup>-31<sup>st</sup> July



A maximum of 3 entries per class / category is allowed per person;

The hall will be open to receive entries from 8-10.00 am on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> September 2016;

Judging will begin at 10.00 am. The hall will not be open to the public until judging is complete. During this time refreshments, including the 'Big Breakfast', will be available to purchase;

The hall will be open to the public from 1.00 until 4.00 pm;

Prizes will be awarded at 3.30 pm;

No exhibit may be removed from the hall until after all prizes have been awarded;

Following the prize-giving, items remaining will be auctioned, with profits going to support next year's show;

The judges' decision is final; no correspondence will be entered into;

#### Northampton Seed Cake

Ingredients: 8 ounces butter, 8 ounces caster sugar, 4 eggs,
8 ounces flour, ½ tsp baking powder, 1tsp nutmeg, 1oz caraway seed.
Method: Oven 180C / mark 4. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
Place eggs in a bowl set over saucepan of hot water, whisk till fluffy then whisk into butter mixture. Sift flour and baking powder together, add nutmeg and fold into mixture. Add caraway seed and combine. Turn into greased and lined 8 inch round tin, smooth over top. Bake for 1½ hours, covering top with foil if browning too quickly.

Cool in tin for 5 minutes, then turn out on wire rack.



#### The Red Lion

Many parishioners will have noticed that there is a sign outside The Red Lion at Fosters Booth advertising the lease for sale. The agents, when contacted, are also offering the option to buy the freehold of the pub and car park.

#### South Northamptonshire Local Plan

The Parish Plan Working Group held two consultation evenings in May to inform residents of the housing options as proposed by South Northants Council. Each of the housing options would provide the parish with a different number of dwellings to

be built by 2029 ranging from 45 to 25. 70% of residents preferred the lesser amount which correlates to the proposal put forward by the parish plan working group and a parish questionnaire conducted in 2013. As there are several dwellings under construction and planning applications in the pipeline there was no pressure to drastically change the parish confines. More details, including maps may be found on the Pattishall Parish website. The council would like to extend their thanks to Bob Illingworth who has given up so much of his time on this project.

#### **Parish Assets**

#### Grant Aid S137

The council were pleased to award  $\pounds$ 3,000 towards the refurbishment of the school toilets and £150 per annum to the Produce Show for the next three years in order that this popular event may continue.

#### Highways

Both the council and members of the public are deeply concerned at the state of the roads within the parish, especially Butchers Lane. The Clerk has written to NCC copying in the new cabinet member for highways. David Hodges, the councillor whose responsibility is for the highways, has met with Helen Howard from NCC/Kier/WSP liaison officer and we look forward to action being taken on the pitiful state of roads within the parish.

#### **Astcote Telephone Box**

Gabriel Abrahams has all the necessary information in order to make enquiries regarding purchasing the box for a nominal fee and during the summer it is hoped that the box, which was due for removal, will be a permanent fixture of our parish.

#### **Grass Mowing**

David Keeble is liasing with All Seasons regarding the mowing after issues being raised by residents. There are adjustments to be made to the present contract and more cuts will be implemented to keep our parish tidy.

#### Maintenance

Robert Hart will inspect the bench on Astcote Green as it appears in need of care and repair.

#### **Bus Shelter**

The council have received a request for a bus shelter on Fosters Booth Road and are actively pursuing costs and specifications. They are also looking at the feasibility of shelters in Astcote & Eastcote.

#### Defibrillator

The school are in the process of acquiring a defibrillator and the council have offered to help with the installation costs. Our thanks go to Sharon Onley who has been instrumental in getting this project off the ground and seeing it through to fruition.
