If calling on a mobile a call back service is now in place between 8am-4pm to prevent long waits during peak demand times. These calls will be extended in the near future.

Chief Inspector Ash Tuckley leads the staff within the Force Control Room at Wootton Hall and his responsibility is the efficiency and performance of the Force Control team in handling, evaluating and responding to 999 and 101 calls.

The focus is on improving the service on these two phone numbers using stricter more efficient emphasis on triage, risk assessment and priority levels. This has necessitated a review of the use of the dedicated Neighbourhood Watch phone number.

### Pattishall Parish Hall Association Pattishall Playing Field Association



The hall roof should be completed by the end of November. Extra work has been undertaken with the replacement of the soffit and barge boards which extended the completion date. The new roof also has better insulation which will improve the energy efficiency of the building. The condition of the roof has been a concern for some time but was deemed essential when water came through the large hall ceiling. This work is costing approximately £55,000 and although we have had grants from Pattishall Parish Council, Garfield Weston and a donation the main contribution has come from the Hall Association's reserve funds which we will have

to replenish over the next few years. The committee thanks you for your support with our efforts in improving this facility. With completion of the roof nearly £300,000 will have been spent on maintaining and upgrading the hall since 2010.

Meanwhile the improvement to the car park, which is the responsibility of the Playing Field Association, is still on our agenda and we have a designated fund for this work. We have been able to spend money on improving the pavilion and the Cricket Club have given freely of their labour and time for this project.

As ever the fund raising continues but always with the idea that it should be for the community and to enjoy as a social occasion. The Quiz with Malcolm Baker was a great success again, the fish and chips were welcomed and the event raised £470.



Our traditional Bonfire and Firework event was organised by Mark Couling and proved very popular with a bumper attendance. The event raised a little under £1400. Thanks are due to Andrew Stratton for the firework display and the many helpers both inside and out for their support. The guy, supplied by the Youth Club, added to the bonfire. Let's have some more for next year please.

The Senior Citizens' Christmas Lunch will be held on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> December, a tradition that started in 1947 and has continued since then. Any Parish resident over the age of 60 is invited so please let Libby (830501) or Iris (830829) know if you wish to attend.

Our membership has remained good this year despite a few members moving away and very sadly one or two being 'Promoted to Glory'.



#### **Red Lion Public House**

The Parish Council have received a communication from The ClearView Planning Company, who are the agents acting on behalf of the owners (FMD LLP). They have produced a scheme whereby there is the possibility of retaining the Red Lion as a public house along with some dwellings on the present site. The Clerk will be in contact with Mr. Luntz from ClearView to invite him to the next parish council meeting on December 14<sup>th</sup>. If he can attend it will be the first item on the agenda at 7:45 pm. Once confirmed then notification will be posted on the parish website and notice boards.

#### Maintenance

An audit of stiles and footpaths is being undertaken and it is proposed that a programme of repair and maintenance will be carried out. Thank you to the residents of School Road for trimming back foliage that encroached on to the pavement and please would all residents who may have hedges etc. protruding on to public footpaths ensure that they are trimmed.

#### **Highways**

Suttons Walk is now hopefully pot hole free and some work has been undertaken on the Gayton Road in Dalscote. We have been informed that Church Street will be next on December 6<sup>th</sup> and School Road on December 20<sup>th</sup>. Someone, other than the council, has been marking pot holes with white paint. I'm sure they thought this was helpful, but sadly it has created confusion and so no more helpful white paint please!

#### **New Homes Bonus**

The council have allocated extra funds for the repair of The Parish Hall roof. Although the parish coffers are stretched, it was agreed that the Parish Hall is an integral part of our community and the council felt it important to support wholeheartedly the re-roofing project. Any organization or individual wishing to apply for funding should do so a month prior to the next parish council meeting so that an informed decision may be made.

#### **Bus Service**

There are concerns that NCC will be cutting or removing our local bus service. This is a vital aspect of village life, as not all households have transport and long gone is the village shop and other amenities.

#### **Burial Costs**

The council having reviewed burial costs and have made a modest increase in costs in line with other neighbouring parishes. Details available from the parish clerk.

#### **Local Plan Two**

The Local Plan Two consultation closed on December 10<sup>th</sup>. The parish council submitted their plans in June 2016 and the confines as defined by SNC were published in 2017. These parish confines were similar, but not exactly the same as to those submitted by your council. There were additions and subtractions which were implemented by SNC without consultation with the council and to date the parish council has been given no reasoning as to why such changes were made. In due course SNC will produce the definitive boundary changes after reviewing correspondence from interested parties received throughout the consultation period.

### Street Lighting

As I write this report it is with great delight that all lights throughout the parish are working. Hooray, and long may E. ON remain on task! Many thanks to Gabriel Abraham whose remit on council is street lighting.

#### Defibrillator

The upkeep of the defibrillator, situated at the school, was discussed and it was agreed that the Parish Council would pay for replacement of pads and other essentials as the equipment was for use of the whole parish. The new Head, Mrs. Emma McLean, of Pattishall School joined us for the meeting and is keen that the school be a part of the community and thanked the council for their support.



### Rt Hon. Andrea Leadsom MP

It has been a busy year and I am sure that everyone is looking forward to Christmas in just a few short weeks. At the time of writing, I am reflecting on the recent Remembrance Day and our solemn commemorations of those who gave their lives for our freedom. This year as Leader of the House I was asked to be at the Cenotaph in London to honour the sons and daughters of parishes across the country who made the ultimate sacrifice.

As the year draws to a close, I wanted to take the opportunity to update residents on a few local matters.

One of the key local issues is, of course, the current construction of the Towcester Southern Expansion and the traffic problems for the town as well as the villages like Cold Higham and Pattishall along the A5. Watling Street continues to clog up with HGVs and other through- traffic; made worse with the recent incidents that have led to the closure of the M1. I recently met with the Roads Minister Jesse Norman MP in order to highlight the need for the relief road to be built as soon as possible. I am aware he is looking at what support he can give to speed up the process. I have assembled a working group – which includes myself, County and District councillors, Highway England, Northants Highways and the developers – with the aim of the relief road opening by the end of 2020 and removing HGVs from the centre of town. This has always been my goal, and I am determined that we achieve it.

Local healthcare is fundamental for our wellbeing, and the nearby GP services in Towcester are outstanding; there is rarely a long delay in getting an appointment. Following the fantastic news recently that the new Brackley Medical Centre has been given the go-ahead – with a range of outpatient services including x-ray facilities, a minor injuries unit and intermediate care beds – there is the opportunity for Towcester to do the same. I am working with our wonderful Towcester GPs as well as Nene Clinical Commission Group to explore what we can do to improve our already fantastic local services. Through the expansion of Towcester, there is the opportunity to increase the provision of outpatient services, making it easier for residents in the surrounding villages to access healthcare closer to home.

On broadband, all residences in Cold Higham and Pattishall should have superfast broadband available. If you have any specific concerns about broadband, let me know and I will look into it for you.

You may be aware that, each year since becoming your MP, I have employed a local school-leaver to join my team as an Apprentice Caseworker. This is a terrific opportunity for paid work whilst also gaining an NVQ in Business Administration, and I was delighted to welcome Emily from Sponne School in September. I will be starting to look for my 2018/19 Apprentice early in the New Year, so if you or someone you know might be interested please do get in touch with me!
