# Major A5 Roadworks

Essential maintenance roadworks are taking place on the A5 from the road bridge over the River Tove (near the entrance to Tesco's) southwards towards the junction of A5 with Marlow Road, Towcester.

This comprehensive scheme of work includes repairs to damaged drains and kerbs, resurfacing of some footways, resurfacing of carriageways, refreshing of road markings and installation of road studs and traffic loops.

The work will also include the reinstatement of a trench over a gas main that runs between the south side of the junction at Brackley and Northampton Roads and the Lindens. Once completed, all road users will benefit from improved road safety and smoother carriageways.

Work is due to start in late July and is scheduled for completion by the end of November 2018. The work will be carried out in two shifts per day Monday to Friday (between 7.00 am and midnight); one shift on Saturday (between 7.00 am and 5.00 pm); and one shift on Sunday (between 8.00 am and 4.00 pm).

All these works are subject to weather constraints.

During these closures there will be:

A temporary closure of gaps in the central reservation on the A43, between the junction with Tiffield Road and the junction with Towcester Road, for the safety of the public.

Fully signed diversion routes which have been agreed with the Local Authority.

A temporary lift in one-way restrictions to enable access and egress for businesses and residents in Park Lane and Browns Yard, and businesses, residents and visitors to Chantry Lane and Moat Lane.

Maintenance of pedestrian access at all times.

### Astcote Phone Box

On Saturday the 14<sup>th</sup> April a team of volunteers from the Parish Council and local area, led by Robert Hart, cleaned, sand-papered and painted the Astcote Telephone Box: first pink which alarmed the locals, then in the true Telephone Box Red – it now looks wonderful.

Robert Hart spent the Friday pressure washing the box inside and outside so it was ready for the team on Saturday.

When Pattishall Parish Council purchased the phone box through the good works of Gabriel Abrahams on behalf of the community, with it came a complete paint kit. Brushes, sand paper, masking tape, undercoat (pink) and top coat (red) together with instruction on how to use it!

The team was fortified with tea, coffee and a fruit cake (there are some perks when you volunteer) supplied by Barry Evans.

It is a K6 designed by Sir Gilbert Scott for King George V in 1936, hence the larger of the two crowns you see on phone boxes!

Margaret Stretton recalls that the phone box was already installed when she moved to the village in 1953, but does not know the actual date of installation. Here is a Quiz question; when was the telephone box installed in Astcote? The winner gets heaped with praise!





#### Parish AGM

There being no other nominations Roger Clarke and Barry Evans were duly elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman for the ensuing year.

### **Highways**

Concern was raised at the appalling conditions of the road surfaces in Leys Road & Blacksmiths Close and the Parish Council has asked NCC to make urgent repairs.

### **Street Lighting**

There are street light poles throughout the village that are not numbered. If you come across one do please let Gabriel Abrahams (gabriel.abrahams@btinternet.com who is the councillor whose remit is lighting throughout the parish.)

### **Astcote Telephone Box**

Lots of positive comments from parishioners about the newly painted telephone box and now we want to know residents thoughts for a suitable use. Please contact the clerk, Ann Addison.

### **Bus Service**

The number 87 bus service is due to end on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> July. Mr. John Ellerby, Principal Bus & Rail Development Officer at Northampton Highways has been in

contact with suggestions for a provisional service. The level of funding required from Parish Councils to provide this service would be £30,000 per annum with the initial agreement for the period 23<sup>rd</sup> July till 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019 of no more than £21,000. The tender for this contract was due back by 23<sup>rd</sup> May. There may be some funding available from The Moat Lane S106 Fund and possibly the education funding links.

### **Grass Mowing**

The contract with Allseasons was ended abruptly due to the ill health of the owner and damage to his machinery by stones left on verges. This happened just as the grass really started to grow but thankfully a resident has stepped in to help with two cuts. This is a trial whilst he and other contractors tender for the contract to mow the many varied grass areas of the parish.

### Churchyard

Due to the problems with the mowing contract the grass had not been cut but this was being addressed. The church is aware of the leaning gravestones as their maintenance falls under the remit of the church.

#### **Bus Service**

Following the Parish Council meeting on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> June and after a lengthy discussion between members of the public (bus users) and Councillors the Parish Council have 'agreed in principal' to support a scheme to retain the No 87 bus, or its equivalent until March 2019, subject to the other parishes along the route contributing. The methodology is yet to be agreed. The Council took the view that if the service was lost it would never be replaced and as it affected so many young and old alike it was deemed a vital action.

#### **Donations**

The Parish Council is pleased to support the school swimming pool project (£500), Picnic in the Park (£500) & The Parish Produce Show (£150).

# **Cold Higham Parish Council**

**Parish Council.** At the Parish Council AGM on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2018 Cllr Nigel Forster was co-opted onto the Council, as the sixth member. We welcome him and thank him for volunteering. There is still one more vacancy on the council – COULD THAT BE YOU? With the pending re-organisation of local government in Northamptonshire it is even more important for the parish to have a full complement of parish councillors.

There was no change to the officers of the Council, who were re-elected. Councillors' responsibilities are reviewed each AGM and published on the web site.

Parish Council Accounts 2017/18. In accordance with the new audit arrangements, the Council, as a Smaller Authority, approved, at its AGM, an Exemption from External Audit Certificate to be submitted to the new auditors, PKF Littlejohn. A copy of this Certificate, together with a copy of the 2017/18 Accounts, the Internal Audit

Report, and the Annual Governance Statement were all published on the Council's web site on 25<sup>th</sup> May.

**Notice of Public Rights.** On 1<sup>st</sup> June a notice of public rights to view any documents relating to the accounts for 2017/18 was also published on the web site. The dates for the exercise of these rights are 4<sup>th</sup> June – 13 July 2018. Please contact the clerk for further information.

**GDPR.** In accordance with the new data protection regulations, the Parish Council has published on its web site its Data Protection Policy and Privacy Notices, along with other relevant papers. These can be found on the new Data Protection tag under 'About the Council' on the main web site menu.



**Litter Pick.** The Parish Council thank all those who turned out for the re-scheduled litter pick on 22<sup>nd</sup> April. The grass was a bit longer than ideal – but at least there wasn't any snow! It was an excellent turnout.

**Cat Shooting.** Recently at least one cat has been shot, possibly with an air gun, in the parish. All animal lovers are asked to be aware of this/these incidents, and everyone is urged to be alert and to report anything suspicious to the police on 101, or anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555111.

And Finally... For several weeks in May signs were on display indicating the closure of Banbury Lane in Fosters Booth for three days. When the date arrived and no closure ensued, the PC contacted Anglian Water. It turns out that the signs were put on the wrong road! Anglian Water have apologised and said they will not use the company responsible for their signage again!!
