Poors Allotment Charity - Cold Higham/Grimscote

Each year the Trustees of the above charity are able to "apply the income of the Charity in relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the Parish of Cold Higham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress, by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons".

In practice this means that funds may be available for:

- 1. Households with at least one householder being aged 65 or over may be granted an amount to help with heating bills. Once a grant has been given it will be given annually without the need to make a new application.
- 2. Students in higher education needing to purchase books or tools or to pay for travelling expenses. A grant may be applied for each year whilst in higher education.
- 3. Any other person in need or distress at any time of the year.

Because of the difficulties experienced by the Trustees in identifying eligible people, those wishing to claim a grant should apply in writing to Mrs Nita Pearson (who is a Trustee of the Charity) by email or post, as follows:

Applications should be received by **5th November 2018**. Members of the community "in need or distress" can apply to the Charity at any time of the year.

Eastcote WW1 Prisoner of War Camp

During the First World War there was a Prisoner of War Camp in Eastcote. It actually included the field opposite the school and all the way into Eastcote with the Headquarters in Eastcote House. 4,500 German prisoners, mainly seamen, were detained during the war. Very few escaped (roughly 35, none of whom made it back to Germany!). Many worked on the local farms and were treated very well.

A century later Pattishall Parish Council are mindful to commemorate this very important part of our local history.

On Saturday 10th November 2018 an event has been organised at which a large stone plaque with appropriate wording will be unveiled on the verge opposite the school adjacent to the field in question. Many dignitaries have been invited including the Lord Lieutenant of Northamptonshire, the High Sheriff of Northamptonshire, the Chairman of South Northamptonshire Council, an Attaché from the German Embassy, Members of the Royal British Legion, the two co-authors of *Detained in England*, the book written to record the camp, the Head Teacher, staff, pupils and parents of Pattishall C of E Primary School and members of the Parish Council.

The pupils of the School are involved with a project that includes the Prisoner of War Camp as well as the 120th anniversary of the school. The event will begin in the school at 10am with those assembled having the opportunity to view the work the pupils have done before gathering outside on the verge in School Road to unveil the Commemorative Plaque.

Members of the parish who would like to witness the occasion will be welcomed.

It was great to see so many children enjoying all the crafts and activities that we put on for them to enjoy this year. Go-carts, stone







County & District News. Sadly, the working relationship between SNC & Cherwell DC is now in the process of being terminated, due to reorganisation of local government. Councillors on both sides are unhappy about the situation as the joint venture has saved over £5 million and kept up the good standard of front line services.

Highways & Footpaths. The potholes along Dalscote Road have finally been addressed. Concern has been raised that Pattishall parish has been removed from the winter gritting rota due to lack of NCC funding. The council has taken on seven grit bins which will be filled later in the year and all costs will now fall upon the Parish Council and not NCC. It was reported that all footpaths are cleared including nettles around some of the styles. The footpath along the play area of Butchers Lane has weeds growing through the tarmac. The council will contact the highways department and also raise the condition of the path running alongside the A5.

Street Lighting. The light in Leys Road has been repaired but the one in Malus Field has to be replaced at a cost of $\pounds 290$

World War One Event. This will coincide with the Pattishall School's 120th anniversary celebrations and will take place on Saturday 10th November 2018. Refreshments at Eastcote House by kind permission of Mr & Mrs Rowden.

Bus Service. The number 87 bus service will continue to March 2019. The new scheme to keep the service has been underwritten by five parish councils, including Pattishall. Continuation will all depend on use & viability.

Grass Mowing. The new mowing contract for the parish has been awarded to Luke Warren who has started work but due to the extremely hot weather conditions, little mowing has taken place.

Hedges & Trees. Work is to be undertaken on sycamore trees coming through the grass in public areas and two lime trees are to be pruned by the church entrance. There are other trees in need of attention and the council is in the process of obtaining quotes for the work.

Allotments. The committee is working hard to remove marestail which has been a rather persistent weed and is now focused on a patch of brambles that have encroached upon some vacant plots. Three new tenants have taken up plots and there are more plots available.

New Homes Bonus. At present there are funds available for a community project. If any groups or organisations within the parish require funding then do please contact the Parish Clerk for details.

Cold Higham Parish Council

New Councillor. The Council is delighted to welcome Kim Attenborough as our latest councillor. Kim joined the Council in July, and we are very grateful to her for volunteering. Our representation in Grimscote and Cold Higham is now good, but it would be nice to have more applicants from Fosters Booth and/or from Potcote, to reflect the population distribution more accurately. Could this be you? Please contact the chairman for more information.

New Parish Clerk. The Council is also very pleased to welcome our new Parish Clerk, Gillian Greaves, an experienced parish clerk familiar with local government in Northamptonshire. She started work on 5th September, and will take a little time to get to know the councillors and the parish. The web site will be updated with her contact details in due course.

Grit Bins. Northants County Council (NCC) have recently been carrying out a survey of the county's winter grit bin provision. They currently fill and maintain seven within the Parish. Their survey concluded that one of the five bins in Grimscote, and both of those in Cold Higham village, no longer fitted their criteria for support. During subsequent discussions, the Parish Council (PC) was able to convince them that two of these three did, indeed, fulfil their criteria, and these will now continue to receive NCC support. The bin opposite No 2 Church Lane in Cold Higham is likely to be moved nearer the junction with Banbury Lane in order to retain this eligibility. However, the other bin in Cold Higham, at the bottom of Church Lane, remains

outside their support criteria. The PC has therefore agreed to take over responsibility for this bin in future, and it will remain in place.

Cold Higham Benches. The Council thanks Nigel Forster for his sterling work in renovating the two public benches at the corner of Church Lane/Banbury Lane. They look much smarter now, and his work should preserve them for many years.

Battle's Over – WW1 Armistice Commemoration (Remembrance Sunday). Plans for the Parish's part in the national commemoration of the Armistice Centenary on the evening of 11 Nov 18 are now mostly in place. The programme of events is:

- 18.00 Village Hall opens for a display of local and wider relevance. Tea/coffee and snacks available. Everyone welcome.
- 18.40 Assemble at the War Memorial.
- 18.50 Readings
- 18.55 Last Post and wreath laying.
- 19.00 The beacon is lit nearby.
- 19.05 The bells of St Luke's Church 'ring out for peace'.
- 19.05 Move back to Village Hall for glass of wine and nibbles and viewing the beacon. Display still available.
- c.20.00 Close

Nationwide, over a thousand other organisations are involved in sounding the Last Post, lighting beacons and bell ringing, as well as other events. The national web site is here: <u>https://www.brunopeek.co.uk</u>.

We will not be holding our usual Remembrance Commemoration in the morning this year.

The Council has been lucky enough to have gained a grant from The Armed Forces Covenant Trust fund for six of the small, seated, *There But Not There* silhouettes. These will form part of the display in the Hall, and will subsequently reside in St Luke's Church as a permanent reminder of the Parish's war dead.
