# Voluntary Drivers Urgently Needed

TADD is a long-established local charity operating a door to door community transport service for the people in the SNC area. The service enables members to attend medically related appointments and services, is affordable and allows them to

retain independence in the absence of suitable public transport and avoid reliance on family, friends and neighbours.

For the first time in over 30 years, the charity has a waiting list of over 100 for membership due to a shortage of volunteer drivers. There are a number of areas and villages in the TADD catchment area, including Cold Higham and surrounding villages where we have a shortage of drivers, which means we have to use drivers from much further afield. This goes against the principle and cost effectiveness of volunteering to support one's local community.

Drivers need to have access to a car, be available on a fairly regular basis for a minimum of half a day a week and complete a DBS check. Mileage is reimbursed at the HMRC rate, insurance premiums are not affected and journeys are allocated weekly by mutual agreement.

# Pattishall Neighbourhood Watch

## **Thefts and Burglaries**

Recently there have been a series of offences within Pattishall Parish including thefts from vehicles, gardens, number plate stolen and an attempted burglary (in which the burglar was disturbed and managed to get away). This is happening in surrounding villages too. The Police believe this is part of a much bigger series of offences being perpetrated in South Northants.

Please make sure your vehicles, sheds, houses and gates are locked. If you are a victim of a theft please report to the Police (even if you didn't lock your property).

## **CCTV**

The Police are very interested in any CCTV footage showing suspicious persons or vehicles.

CCTV must be produced to the Police by persons owning it so that it can be exhibited properly and provides continuity of that evidence for CPS and ultimately Court.

CCTV will only be evidential if it shows a person committing an offence.

Any Stills or CCTV forwarded by a third party may be used in intelligence – to allow the Police to quickly circulate to officers to try to identify an offender but they still need the original footage.

CCTV that just shows a person only can be used to corroborate that they were present in a location but does not prove they committed the offence.

If residents are struggling to create stills or a copy of the footage then they can contact the Police direct. They will try to get an officer to come and assist.

Please remain vigilant and continue reporting any suspicious incident/persons/vehicles on 101. Sometimes the phone is not answered – this is because 999 phone calls at that time are so high there is no one to answer 101. However, if you phone 101 from a mobile there is a call back option.



# **Cold Higham Parish Council**

**New Councillor.** At its meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> March, the Council co-opted Danny Everest Hayes to fill the vacancy on the Council. Danny lives in Cold Higham village. The Council thanked him for his interest, and welcomed him most sincerely.

**Litter Pick.** Very many thanks to the gallant crews who turned out in Cold Higham and Grimscote on a bright, sunny Sunday morning on 24<sup>th</sup> March. The general consensus was that slightly less rubbish was collected than in previous years – a good sign, perhaps? (Post script. Why do coke cans and fast food wrappers appear again immediately after the litter pick?!)

Recuperating in Cold Higham

**Annual Parish Meeting.** This was held before the Parish Council meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> March. A summary of the year's activities was given, including: the turnover of personnel; introduction of GDPR; parish upkeep (trees and grass cutting remain our largest financial commitment); Remembrance Sunday. The full report can be viewed on the web site (<a href="https://www.coldhigham-pc.gov.uk/uploads/apm---chairmans-report.pdf">https://www.coldhigham-pc.gov.uk/uploads/apm---chairmans-report.pdf</a>).

**New Street Lights.** The PC has been lucky to be granted money from the New Homes Bonus scheme, run by SNC, to replace some, at least, of our aging street lights. This will save the Council a considerable amount of money over time, cut our carbon footprint and give greater flexibility in running the lights. The PC will now be seeking the best providers of the new LED lights, and working out which lights are highest priority for replacement. The project will take several months to complete, and before contracts are awarded there will be a parish consultation/briefing. This has provisionally been booked for Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> August at 7pm in the parish hall. More details will follow, on the web site and in Around Pattishall. The PC is most grateful to SNC for the grant.

**Local Crime.** There would seem to be a sharp increase in local crime, particularly theft from and/or damage to vehicles. Both have been reported in Cold Higham and Pattishall. The PC advises all residents to be particularly vigilant at present, and report anything suspicious to the police on **101**.

Communicating within the Parish. The PC has been looking for efficient ways of keeping parishioners informed about very local information/activities. The recent spate of crime locally has propelled this to the fore. We are therefore trialling a scheme called Nextdoor. Each neighbourhood (e.g. CH Parish) creates a private Nextdoor website that is accessible only to the residents of that neighbourhood, and is password protected. Once someone joins they can find neighbours in the resident directory, view a neighbourhood map, ask for and give advice (e.g. a good babysitter), exchange local recommendations (e.g. a decent restaurant), and share information with each other (e.g. crime activity, village fete) etc. But only people within the defined neighbourhood will be allowed to join.

The PC has set up the CH Parish Nextdoor web site and arranged for invitations to CH Parish residents to be sent (usually by post card). Each address has to be verified to ensure that the scheme is truly local. Once enrolled, a member can opt to be emailed new posts and comments as soon as they occur; receive everything in a daily digest; or turn off all emails and check the website for new content when convenient. Nextdoor can be used on a computer, tablet or smart phone. The scheme is completely free, and no personal data will be used or sold for marketing purposes.

For more information see <a href="https://help.Nextdoor.com/s/?language=en\_GB">https://help.Nextdoor.com/s/?language=en\_GB</a>. The PC hopes this will greatly improve the sense of community within the Parish.

**Good Neighbour Scheme.** As part of our continued support of our community the PC is also considering introducing the "Good Neighbour scheme". This is run by local people to provide day-to-day support for other residents who may need help on an occasional or regular basis. The scheme provides a social 'safety net' for our villages and the local area. As part of the scheme volunteers complete practical tasks (such as driving or shopping) and/or provide emotional support (befriending).

The Good Neighbour Scheme is for residents of all ages. All the scheme's services are free, unless expenses such as petrol or parking have been incurred. Donations for running costs are usually welcomed with funding provided at a national level. It is open to all residents within an area, and people can be both users of the scheme and volunteer.

Rural parishes are having to become more resilient and self-supporting, particularly with the impending local government reorganisation. This is why we believe the Good Neighbour Scheme would be a welcome service to the Parish. Tackling loneliness and social isolation is something we can all help and support with, especially when the hard to reach & possibly loneliest are not on anyone's radar. More details later.

**Parish Council Meetings.** The PC meets eight times a year, generally on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of the month (not in April, August, December or February) at 7.30 in the parish hall. All the year's dates are on the web site. Members of the public are always welcome to attend. Agendas and Minutes are available on the web site (meeting papers can most easily be accessed via the relevant meeting on the 'What's On' pages). The next meeting, on 16<sup>th</sup> May, will be the PC's AGM.

He has produced a very comprehensive working paper for fellow councillors to use when they inspect the play equipment during the first week of each month of the year. Sadly, the zip wire is still out of use as the council are in dialogue with Kompan, the company that installed the equipment, insisting that they make good their faulty installation as it is still under guarantee.

# **Dogs & Footpaths**

It has been noted that there are dogs roaming around fields and not being kept to footpaths. At this time of the year with pregnant sheep and young lambs skipping around it is important that dogs are monitored more closely. Please ensure that your faithful friend is either walked on a lead or is kept to footpaths at all times.

# **Neighbourhood Watch**

There has been a spate of burglaries in the area, mostly from parked vehicles, including removal of number plates. It is important to report any such activity straight away either to 999 or 101 and, whenever possible, to get the number plates of any suspicious vehicles. The police would be interested in any appropriate CCTV footage. This

criminal activity can be reduced by all residents being more aware and do please be an active participant in your local Neighbourhood Watch. Details may be obtained from the Parish Website.

### **Allotments**
