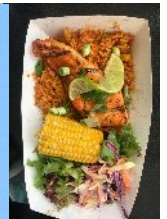

They had to work collaboratively to decipher and decode in order to unlock boxes within boxes locked with combination padlocks, until they ultimately "escaped" the room. A fantastic exercise in teamwork and logic.

Towcester & District Angling Association

Towcester & District AA membership books are now on sale – and there are NO price increases on last year.

We have had a busy year working on the club's waters and putting together plans to improve the future.

Our £4,000 grant from the Environment Agency for improving Astwell Mill is already being put to good use and has, so far, paid for work to help control excessive weed growth. That includes a new silt filtration pond which helps remove incoming silt from water flowing in off the land behind the far bank wood, and also for various chemical treatments including Siltex – to help reduce accumulated organic silt – and to help limit future growth. Both are beginning to prove successful, though our efforts were nearly overcome by the record temperatures late last summer. It was quite a challenge but we are confident we can deal with it this year even if we get another heatwave.

Work is due to continue on improving the 'field bank' and access to it, while volunteers have again been improving and increasing the number of the platforms on both lakes during the close season, and a new gate has just been fitted to the bottom lake – doing away with the need to climb over that awful stile as was the case in previous years!

Bankside vegetation trimming has again been part of the close season at Astwell and a major effort has been made at Silverlake where a great deal of self-set shrubbery has been removed to try and lessen 'predation' by human and non-human means!

Various platforms have been improved/replaced and in some cases, earthworks have allowed installation of steps down the bank to them – all carried out by volunteers working with the farmer.

We are also due a meeting with EA fishery scientists to look for ways to improve spawning opportunities for the fish at Silverlake, the ambition being to make a good fishery even better!

On the downside we have lost the, largely under-used, Seven Acres pond near Paulerspury because the owner has died and the site is being sold.

Back on the upside the members' offer of £3 weekday discounted tickets at Lakeside continues.

We are working closely with the Canal River Trust and other local clubs on the Trust's 'Lets Fish' programme of organised coaching sessions to try and increase the number of newcomers of all ages (but especially juniors) coming into the club. We need such newcomers to help ensure a healthy future for both the sport and the club and thank CRT for their co-ordinated campaign.

Many thanks to all who joined last year and we look forward to seeing you on the club's banks again in the year to come.

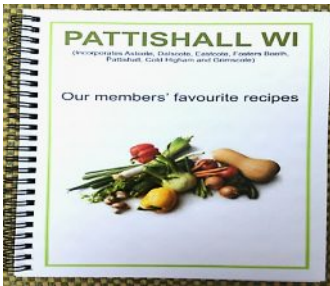

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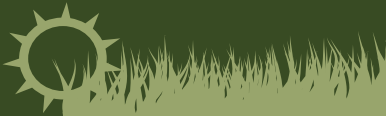

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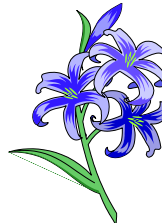

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Cold Higham Parish Council

PC Annual Meeting. On 16th May the PC held its Annual Meeting. The chairman and vice chairman were re-elected, and responsibilities of all councillors agreed. The full list of councillors and the distribution of responsibilities can be seen on the web site at <https://www.coldhigham-pc.gov.uk/the-council.html>.

Audit of Council Accounts. Prior to the Annual Meeting the internal auditor appointed by Northants County Association of Local Councils had visited the clerk and conducted the annual audit. There were no significant comments raised. The council approved the accounts and audit report and certificate of exemption from external audit, and these can all be seen on the web site at <https://www.coldhigham-pc.gov.uk/fy-201819.html>.

Notice of Public Rights. This can be seen at <https://www.coldhigham-pc.gov.uk/uploads/notice-of-public-rights-publication.pdf>. In essence, anyone has the right to inspect the accounts at the clerk's office between 17th June and 26th July, with reasonable notice.

Future Meeting Dates. There have been a couple of alterations to parish council meetings this year. Dates for the rest of the year 19/20 are as follows: 25 July, 19 September, 24 October, 21 November, 16 January 2020, 19 March 2020. All will take place at 7.30pm in the parish hall.



New Street Lights. The council has obtained a number of quotes to replace the current street lights, for which we have obtained a grant from SNC. The aim is to save money over the long term, as well as reducing our carbon footprint. The existing, mainly wooden, poles will be retained, but the one on Litchborough Road, which is concrete, is at the end of its life and needs replacing. The options are now being analysed for best value. There will be a public briefing on the council's proposed way forward in the parish hall at 7pm on Thursday 8th August. All are welcome to attend, and in particular if you live near a street light you are encouraged to do so.

Nextdoor App. Residents are encouraged to sign up for the Nextdoor App and keep informed about VERY local activity. Recent posts have appealed for help looking for lost pets, requests for recommendations about local trades people, and even information about when the International Space Station is passing overhead!

Signage at Grimscote. Following HGV damage in the village of Grimscote in the winter, the council had asked Northants CC to erect signs stopping HGVs going through the village. The CC have indicated that they currently do not have the funds, but were hopeful of more funds later in the year. The PC will keep chasing the CC.

Pattishall Annual Parish Meeting

A number of members of the public were in attendance but saving their issues to the subsequent Parish Council meeting. The Chairman Roger Clarke gave his annual report which highlighted all the work the Parish Council had completed during the year and how it had supported financially many groups in the parish. The Parish Hall with its massive refurbishment, the Cricket Club, Picnic in the Park, now a independent hugely successful event with over 1500 people attending. We supported the school with a heat pump to warm the swimming pool, the Garden of Remembrance required tree maintenance and the Old Burial Ground holly hedge, always a problem to maintain, now replaced with a new hedge which will be much easier to maintain.

Several volunteers do a lot of work unknowingly to the many; Michael Fleck has maintained the Garden of Remembrance for many years, he does this purely as a service to the community. Nigel Banister cleans the Banbury Lane road signs as necessary, Linda Hemming is the coordinator for over 130 contacts in our Neighbourhood Watch System. Andy Stewart edits the bi-monthly *Around Pattishall* that we share with Cold Higham and Grimscote and Bob Illingworth maintains the website. Our field pathways and bridleways are maintained by John Russell and John Woollett and Ann Atkin fought to retain the No.87 bus which incidentally the Pattishall Parish Council together with Hunsbury Meadow, Rothersthorpe, Green Norton and Towcester have underwritten and is now guaranteed until March 2020.

The Parish Council coordinated a very successful celebration of the schools 120th anniversary and the 100th anniversary of the Pattishall/Eastcote Prisoner of War Camp with over 150 people including the Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Northamptonshire attending the Blessing of the Commemoration Stone in School Road.

The Annual Spring Clean was supported by over 40 volunteers who completed the job in record time. This was mainly due to less rubbish, thankfully. Thanks extended to young and old from Beavers and Cubs to the older volunteers!

Roads throughout the parish continue to cause concern. Following a toured guide by the County Councillor responsible for roads we are assured that 'some' work will be completed.

Two Councillors retired during the year and their replacements are now in place.

Thanks were expressed to all Councillors: Barry Evans, David Hodges, Mark Mitton, David Keeble, Robert Hart, Martin Gardner, Phil Parris and Jayne Hawtin for their work during the year and to Ann Addison our Parish Clerk and Chief Financial officer who provides for our every need.

I have completed my 3 year stint as chairman and now stand down. Barry Evans takes over as Chairman with Martin Gardner as Vice Chairman.

Annual General Meeting of Pattishall Parish Council

Owing to the Chairman's absence Roger Clarke chaired the meeting.

As has been the rule with the Parish Council each Councillor is allocated a portfolio, this helps to share responsibility and maintain interest. The portfolio's include: finance, newsletter, highways, planning, allotment liaison, grass cutting, trees & hedges, village maintenance, school liaison, lighting, playing field inspection (monthly rota), notice boards and Neighbourhood Plan.

Pattishall Pre-school Group offers a daily service in the village hall, they have requested help to organise themselves as a committee and help with administering grant applications. They will be working more closely with the school and parents, so they match the actual needs required.

Three Planning applications were considered by the Council, all gaining the parish council support

Current issues being addressed are street lights, car parking on the roads, broken manholes failed lights broken swings, painting of play equipment and of course road surfaces.

The Parish Council adopted the following Audit Matters: Internal audit date; External audit date; Parish Council accounts for 2018/2019; Annual Return; Standing Orders; Responsible Financial Officer; Internal and External Auditors; Financial Regulations & Risk Analysis Policy; Discrimination; Disability Policies & Complaints procedures; Review Effectiveness of Internal Audit; Finance Member checks invoices against cheques and note a trial quarterly balance and Annual Governance Statement.

The Council is considering installing posts along the verge in School Road opposite the school owing to the erosion of the verge by school traffic.

At the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council held on May 9th Mr. Barry Evans was elected as Chairman and Dr Martin Gardner as Vice Chairman of Pattishall Parish Council. These positions are for a maximum of a three-year tenure.

Grass Mowing

There has been a request that there be a space left between the hedges & walls on grass verges for wildflowers to grow and on reflection it was decided that there were several areas within the parish where verges were not cut, and wildflowers could thrive. The council also had received many comments on how neat and tidy the mown areas throughout the parish look. The footpath that runs alongside the school is to be included in the mowing schedule.

Play Equipment

The zip wire is still out of use as the council are still in dialogue with Kompan, the company that installed the equipment but are still awaiting communication from the company. In the meantime, it has been decided to look at making good the equipment so that it will be available for use in the summer.

Community Police Officer

The cost to the parish of a community police officer would be approximately £38,000 per annum. The council will be contacting other neighbouring parishes to see if they would be interested in joining a collaborative approach in order to spread the costs. Residents are asked to contact the clerk and/or the chairman with their thoughts on the subject.

Dogs along Footpaths

The state of dog mess in the parish is still a concern and thanks go to the Beavers for distributing doggie bags, found in large plastic bottles, throughout the area: Please would ALL dog walkers use them. Footpaths that run through agricultural land is also plagued by unwanted dog presents; please treat these footpaths the same as pavements and verges and scoop your dog's poop up and dispose of responsibly.

Anti-social Behaviour

Many residents have noticed a gathering of cars in the car park opposite the school. This is a regular occurrence after dark when rowdy, anti-social activities are afoot. It is intended that a gate at the entrance be closed at the end of the school/nursery day to act as a deterrent. Should residents notice any suspicious activity in the area please notify the police as a matter of course and the parish council so we may monitor the situation.

Picnic in the Park

The council are pleased to donate £540 for the purchase of bollards to enable the organisers to make parking more efficient and safer for those attending the event. These cones will be available for other groups/organisations to use.

Parking

Parking at the bottom of Sandpit Hill, Astcote and along School Road is proving a problem for pedestrians. Please would those car owners, parking on the pavement please not continue to do so.

Highways

More white markings around potholes have been drawn over existing ones but the parish is not scheduled for any work during the next two months. The council will keep lobbying for the work to be done but individuals can help by contacting Streetdoctor.

Hedges & Trees

Work is to be scheduled on trimming back two lime trees in the churchyard and it is intended to replace three dead trees along the Gayton Road in Eastcote.



Bus News

Since early January the No. 87 now travels to Northampton via Sainsbury's at Sixfields giving access to Argos, Boots, Next, M & S Food, and even the Cinema if you time it right! There are slight changes to some of the timings on the new timetable. The first bus in the morning is now starting at Silverstone, meaning an increased revenue which helps towards the running of the service.
