Our October 'Big Light' event coincided with our extremely successful open day. Children worked together across the school to create artwork, conduct scientific experiments linked to light, make light-themed music and write poetry. They learned about Diwali, 5th November 1605 and the significance of the candle in Christianity – representing Jesus, the light of the world.

This year, our children have decorated jam jars with poppy designs and displayed them on our new perimeter fence; each with a tea light within. Many of our children were involved in the Holy Cross service on Sunday 10th November, through Beavers, Cubs and Scouts or as representatives of the school. 

After many years of service to the parish Roger Clarke will be retiring from the council in April. In the Spring edition of *Around Pattishall* more details regarding how to apply to join the council will be published. On behalf of parishioners and councillors past and present, the Chairman thanked Roger for his time and work spent on parish matters. His wealth of knowledge & experience will be sadly missed.

Play Equipment. The Council has decided to pay the costs of repairing the zip wire, as the installation company appears reluctant to make good the problems that have led to the equipment being deemed unsafe. Quotes will be obtained along with those for the Booth Close play area, with installation hopefully scheduled for March 2020.

Highways. There has been a suggestion that wooden stakes referred to as Dragon's Teeth should be placed in the verge next to the memorial on School Road to prevent further erosion of the grass verge. They would be installed at suitable distances to allow car doors to be opened. Quotes have been received and it is hoped to instruct work to be carried out during school holidays to prevent major disruption at drop off & pick up times. It appears that potholes are being filled but there are

areas such as Blacksmiths Close, Leys Road and Festival Road that are in urgent need of repair. The council will contact the Highways but residents as always should call Street Doctor on 0300 126 1000. Several residents have raised concerns about the traffic parked and travelling through Astcote High Street. It appears the volume of traffic has significantly increased, and parked cars quite often line the road for more than 200 metres. It was thought that little could be done but the council would be happy to receive any suggestions that might alleviate the problem.

Bus. Ann Atkin had some very good news about the bus service which now incorporates early and late buses to Brackley. Since last August the number of people using the service each day has greatly extended to the point that an afternoon bus may be implemented.

Eastcote Chapel. The Chapel Wall in Eastcote has been repaired and thanks to Mr. Hitchmough for refurbishing the Eastcote notice board. Sadly, the chapel will close due to costs of maintenance and a dwindling number of worshippers. There will a final service on December 8th at 3pm and all parishioners are warmly invited to attend.

Neighbourhood Watch. Linda Hemming, our parish neighbourhood watch coordinator is seeking a couple of street wardens to help keep our parish safe. Rural crime is escalating in our area and thankfully to date we have not been too badly ransacked. But we all need to be vigilant for our own and our fellow neighbours' property. Ride-on mowers and quad bikes seem to be highly prized! There was a Neighbourhood Watch meeting at the parish hall on November 28th. **Pattishall Graveyard.** It has come to the attention of the council whose duty it is to maintain the graveyard that there are several trees in need of attention. This is going to be a costly but necessary operation along with some remedial hedge trimming at The Old Burial Ground.

Environmental Policy. We have had requests as to the content of the parish environmental policy. In truth we do not have such a document, but the council felt it important that one was developed. The Chairman will meet with children from the local school to get the next generation's input and hopefully a draft policy will be available for the next parish council meeting. One aspect would be to recognise the importance of hedgerows as an essential corridor for wildlife. Thus, the council were rather astonished to note that a recent planning application to remove about 150 metres of hedge was agreed by SNC prior to any input from the parish council.

Eastcote Arms Public House. This has been bought by Richard & Janice Bustin who own the Litchborough microbrewery. We welcome them and are really pleased that we will retain a pub in our parish in addition to Peggoty's. We wish the previous owners Greg & Janey all the very best.

Christmas Lunch. This annual event, which has been going for 72 years, will be held at the Parish Hall on December 7th. Marvellous food and tipples galore for those parishioners over sixty. Events are held, such as Bonfire Night to pay for this lunch but sadly it has been very poorly attended by the sixty to seventy age range. The lunch is not a charitable event but a chance to celebrate the festive season with fellow residents and the organisers are really keen that as many parishioners join this year to make

it extra special. Please do contact Iris Illingworth (830829) should you be able to attend, preferably by December 2nd, although late additions will be welcome.

Cold Higham Parish Council

New Street Lights. On 30th September, 10 of the street lights in the parish were replaced with new LEDs. The new lights are along Banbury Lane (three) and throughout Grimscote (seven). As reported in the last *Around Pattishall*, the lights in Church Lane, Cold Higham, will have to await Western Power's replacement of the electricity poles. We still have no date for this. Unfortunately the light on Litchborough Road is proving slightly more problematic than originally thought, and plans are still being formulated to replace this.

As well as saving around 60% on electricity costs, and considerably reducing our carbon footprint, the new lights are generally considered much more effective, as illustrated in these photos of 'before' and 'after'.



Parish Council Election. The delayed election for the PC, along with other councils, will take place on 7th May 2020. The new council will sit for five years. All information regarding the election will be included on the website in due course, but residents are asked to consider now if they could consider standing for their

PC. New blood is always needed. The coming years are likely to prove 'interesting' with the arrival of the two unitary authorities in Northants.

VE75 – Victory in Europe Day. The 75th anniversary of this event will be celebrated nationally across the weekend of 8th – 10th May (Friday 8th being a Bank Holiday). We plan to coordinate with Pattishall. Present plans are for a Children's Party and Entertainment on the afternoon of 8th May in Cold Higham Parish Hall and for a Barn Dance for all ages in Pattishall Hall on the Saturday evening. Details will be included in the next *Around Pattishall* and on both parish websites.

Remembrance Sunday. A welcome break in the rainy weather enabled our usual parish Remembrance ceremony to



take place in splendid sunshine at the War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday (10th November).
