
### **Pattishall Parochial Charities**

## Poors Allotment Charity - Cold Higham/ Grimscote

Each year the Trustees of the above charity are able to 'apply the income of the Charity in relieving, either generally or individually, persons resident in the Parish of Cold Higham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress, by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons'.

In practice this means that funds may be available for:

- 1. Households with at least one householder being aged 65 or over may be granted an amount to help with heating bills. Once a grant has been given it will be given annually without the need to make a new application.
- 2. Students in higher education needing to purchase books or tools or to pay for travelling expenses. A grant may be applied for each year whilst in higher education.
- 3. Any other person in need or distress at any time of the year

Because of the diff culties experienced by the Trustees in identifying eligible people, those wishing to claim a grant should apply in writing to Mrs Nita Pearson (who is a Trustee of the Charity) by email or post, as follows:

St Lukes church stands in a prominent position in the centre of Cold Higham.

The church has served its population over hundreds of years, it now needs your help! The church is a grade 2\* historic building. It has had Victorian additions in the form of the North aisle and the chancel. It is the chancel that is giving grave cause for concern as the East wall is falling outwards taking the side walls with it.

The stonework on the tower is also suffering from the affects of the prevailing weather, this is the oldest part of the church.

To bring our ancient building into good repair we need to raise approx £400,000 and we cannot do this without the help of our community.

It would be a very sad day to see our beautiful church closed due to it being unsafe. The Rector, Churchwarden and Parochial Church Council are calling a PUBLIC MEETING on MONDAY, NOVEMBER 8<sup>th</sup> at 5-8pm in the CHURCH to give everyone a chance to hear more details from the Archdeacon and the Architect. We look forward to welcoming you to this meeting.



of 1609 reads, 'Be it known to all that doth see me that Newcombe of Leicester made me'. Our previous set of 5 bells were recast and re-hung in a new bell frame with one additional bell by Gillett & Johnston in 1908. Now, after more than a century of service, a major overhaul is due...

### Why Bells?



Bells of all types have been used down the ages to let the local community know that something is about to

happen: the time of day; the passing of a loved one; the joy of marriage; the plaque; the start of a church service; the advance of a marauding army (fortunately not in recent times!). In England the Art and Science of Change Ringing (Campanology) developed from the 17<sup>th</sup> century and has become a hobby enjoyed by many thousands of people of all ages and backgrounds. Bell ringers enjoy the mental and physical challenge of pealing bells together in harmony and the camaraderie that often goes with it. Bells are very much a community asset

which offer a much-needed opportunity for mental and physical activity whilst preserving a heritage tradition. The improved ringing facilities will enable more people to learn and participate in this social activity, which is also healthy exercise. Ringing can also be included in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme for young people.

### What is happening?

Our existing 6 bells will not be modif ed in any way as they are tuned to modern standards and in good condition. However, their wheels, bearings and

other f ttings are in urgent need of replacement. The existing bells are therefore to be re-hung in a

new bell frame with new bearings, wheels and other f ttings, with the addition of 2 new lighter bells to provide a full octave ring of 8 bells.

Shutters are to be f tted to the tower louvres so that the sound level may be reduced for bell practices and other special periods of sustained ringing. We are also planning to upgrade our bell training simulator, which will improve our facility to train new bell ringers.

In summary the project includes:-

- A new bell frame for 8 bells
- New bell wheels, bearings and other f ttings
- 2 new small bells
- A set of new bell ropes
- A Sound Control System (to reduce sound levels)
- A bell training simulator (for silent practice)

### How to help?

Now that we have obtained approval from the Diocese we can start fundraising in earnest. The total cost of these works is estimated to be around £95k. The bell ringers themselves will provide labour worth approximately £13k and grants have already been secured for £15.5k. Personal donations so far total £16k, leaving a funding gap of around £50k, some of which has already been pledged.

Once the work is underway there will be opportunities to assist with removing and re-installing the bells, and in providing B&B accommodation for the contractor.



### NOTICE OF A SPECIAL MEETING AND VOTE IN THE PARISH OF PATTISHALL

Date: Thursday, 9<sup>th</sup> December 2021

Time: 6.30pm (to finish no later than 7.30pm)

Location: Pattishall Parish Hall, School Road, Astcote, Northamptonshire, NN12 8NN

Invitees: All inhabitants of Pattishall Parish aged 18 (eighteen) and upwards on the date of the meeting and vote. Also, members of the Cornhill Squash Club Committee.

Please note that, to be eligible, all votes must be cast in person by Pattishall Parish inhabitants aged 18 (eighteen) and upwards on this date and time and at this location. Postal, electronic or remote votes will not be accepted. The votes will be counted and the result announced at the end of the meeting.

Purpose: To comply with the terms of Clause 10 of the 1970 Conveyance Schedule, the Cornhill Squash Club Committee requires the consent by majority vote of the inhabitants of the Pattishall Parish aged 18 (eighteen) and upwards to allow the use of the squash court to be discontinued at Cornhill at some point in the future, yet to be determined.

If the majority vote is in favour of allowing the squash court use at Cornhill to be discontinued, it is proposed that the playing of squash will be relocated to another existing or new facility, yet to be identified, but situated within the general catchment area of Towcester and the surrounding parishes.

 Background:
 As per Clause 10 of the Cornhill Squash Court Conveyance Schedule dated 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1970, the Cornhill Squash Club Committee wishes to discontinue the use of (i.e. sell) the Cornhill Squash Court (the Trust Property) that sits within Pattishall Parish to use the sale proceeds to create a new, more sustainable, more accessible squash facility within 10 (ten) miles of the existing property. Note: A copy of the 1970 Conveyance document will be available for viewing at the meeting/vote on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2021 in the Pattishall Parish Hall.

The primary reasons for this proposed discontinuance are as follows:

- A year-on-year declining membership that has resulted in financial difficulties for the Club. This trend in membership is likely to result in the Club at Cornhill closing in the foreseeable future.
- 2. Inadequate facilities, particularly the changing rooms, showers, heating and lighting.
- Increasing maintenance issues, largely driven by the squash court approaching its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary.
- 4. Non-standard court dimensions and wooden roof beams in the playing area due to the squash court originally being a dilapidated cow shed.
- 5. The remote Club location. This has proven to be a major deterrent when trying to attract younger people to the game of squash.

He helped us all in so many ways, whether it be mending swings or repairing notice boards he generously gave of his time, often with his wife Daphne by his side. He will be missed but we will be able to remember him as Daphne and the family are to donate a bench in his honour to be placed in the parish.

In May there were Parish Council elections where Barry Evans agreed to remain as chair for his last year of a three-vear tenure and Phil Parris became the new vice chairman. We also welcomed Fiona Mytton to the council. Fiona lives in Eastcote and takes over the responsibility of lighting within the parish. Although we had said goodbye to Roger Clarke over a year ago, we had subsequently requested that he remain on council through the past year as the elections originally scheduled for 2020 were delayed a year due to the pandemic. Martin Gardener stepped down from council as his work commitments meant it was diff cult for him to attend and participate as he would like. We thank Martin for his contribution and wish him well.

### **Community Spirit**

There can be no denying that the past months have been challenging but gradually life is beginning to show a semblance of normality. It is encouraging to see that organisations are starting to put on events such as the Produce Show, which was extremely well attended, and most clubs are back up running.

### Traff c and Parking

The Council receive many complaints about the speed of vehicles through our parish which we take very seriously. Any form of road changes is the responsibility of The Highways Department. A little bit of background about myself. I grew up in Bristol and studied law and theology at the University of Bristol, before doing research master's degree in theology at the University of Exeter. I did my formational training at the Queen's Foundation in Birmingham, with ministry placements in Stirchley (Birmingham), the east end of London, the Yorkshire Dales, Rome, and Sri Lanka. I then did two years' probation, and three years as an ordained presbyter, in Hull where I had pastoral responsibility for three churches and other chaplaincy duties. Prior to being a minister, I had various roles in the charitable, local government, and higher education sectors.

Recently the headteacher of Pattishall Church of England School invited me for a tour. While I was visiting, I noticed the school's vision statement, which is inspired by the words of St Paul in 1 Corinthians 16: 13-14:

"Keep alert, stand f rm in your faith, be courageous, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." It occurred to me that these words, advocating resilience and encouraging loving responsibility, are important not just for a school but also for our communities as well.

We are going through a challenging time; one where a great many people have been experiencing signif cant hardship. The resilience test for our communities is how we support each other, and particularly the weakest and most vulnerable, by being alert to our neighbours needs and by offering help and support when and where we can.

Those of us at Astcote Methodist Church hope that we can be a support to all, by sharing the love of Christ within the community. I hope that we can all work together in this task and in so doing help enable our communities to be resilient and to f ourish.
