Reducing our Plastic Waste

Did you know that single use plastic makes up 40% of the plastic produced annually, but it remains in the environment for hundreds of years! Only 9% of the plastic that is produced is recycled, the remaining 91% ends up being incinerated, or in landf II, making it into our oceans, our environment, and even the f sh that we eat.

We cannot remove plastic completely, but with a few small changes we can reduce the amount of plastic we throw away. Good ways to reduce your plastic waste are:

- Use a ref llable bottle for your water
- Take your own reusable cup for takeaway drinks
- Buy loose goods from a Ref II Shop

Green Machine is a mobile ref II shop that will be coming to Pattishall Parish Hall every 1st & 3rd Thursday of the month (12-2pm), making it much easier to reduce the plastic packaging you throw away. Ref Il Shops are extremely easy to use - you bring along any clean container (it can be a jar, tub, even an old sandwich bag), it is weighed beforehand, f lled with the contents you want, weighed again and you only get charged for what you buy. There is the added advantage that you can choose how much you want, so you only buy what you need rather than a f xed amount.

Green Machine sells high quality dried foods (pasta, rice, nuts, seeds, dried fruit, herbs, baking goods etc) and ecofriendly toiletry & cleaning liquid ref lls. The full list of items can be seen on the website (www.greenmachineref Il.co.uk). If you are unable to visit the shop on Thursdays, you can order a home delivery or visit one of the other shop

locations in Towcester, Greens Norton, Blisworth or Silverstone. If you have a home delivery, you can leave your containers somewhere safe, and they are ref lled even if you are not at home.

This is a time of year that is fairly quiet for a lot of anglers, however pike f shermen are just beginning their season. There have been a number of very good catches at Astwell Mill, both in the top and bottom lakes. Several double f gure f sh have been landed as well as a number of singles (4lb-15lb).

At this time of year cormorants are starting to move inland, these birds are unwelcome guests at any f shery, so we have put ropes across both Astwell top lake and Silverlake to deter them from landing. They are not pretty, but they will help to protect our valuable f sh from becoming a take-away feast for Cormorants.

Following a recent very generous donation to the Club from a member who would like to remain anonymous and a top up from club funds, we have decided on the mix of species, size and location for our re-stocking programme. The f sh will be introduced to Astwell (Tench) and Silverlake next spring and should show well in the coming season.



Dear Reader.

This Advent season. Christians across the world will join in singing one of the great Advent carols written by Charles Wesley 'Come thou long expected Jesus' the first verse of which reads:

Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; from our fears and sins release us. let us f nd our rest in thee.

Inspired by a verse of scripture in the Hebrew Bible (Old Testament) found in Haggai 2:7, which talks of the shaking of the nations. Wesley wrote this carol in anticipation of what the coming of Jesus might mean for the world.

As the writer Ace Collins points out, in his book entitled 'More stories behind the best loved songs of Christmas', Charles Wesley lived in a time when poverty, disease, and hunger were rampant in British society. Collins goes on to observe that Wesley would have been very aware of the huge gaps between the rich and the poor, that political corruption was commonplace, and that the evils of racism would be most evident in the transatlantic slave trade. All this pointed towards a world that needed to be changed and redeemed to be more like the Kingdom of God, where human needs are met and where the dignity and worth of every human being is recognised and aff rmed. A world in which everyone experiences life in all its fullness.

More than two hundred years after this carol was written, the problems of poverty, disease, corruption, and racism are still very evident. Combined with the challenges surrounding global warming and climate change, there very much remains a need for our global society to be changed and renewed.

Which is why the hope that comes with the Advent season is so important. In hope, that the world can be transformed by Christ, we are able to critique the present reality and also imagine a world that is very different from our own. A world where human need and human dignity are aff rmed, as it is shaped by the unconditional love of Jesus.

In this Advent season I hope and pray that we might consider what the coming of Christ might mean for the world and for each of us personally. What do we long and hope for, and what fears do we need to be released from, in order to find life in all its fullness?

Fritz and Fleur won a plethora of rosettes between them at various shows throughout the country.

In 2014 at The Suffolk Show Fritz won the overall reserve championship but a month later could he go one better at

He had also become more obstinate and had no problem in standing still in a line up but at times was reluctant to put his best foot forward when asked to parade by the judge. Fritz won his section and was again going to be in the f nal line up, but he was digging his hooves in!

As there was a wait till the f nal line, I decided not to take him back to his pen in the marque but to keep him just outside the ring. Our good friends Maria and Gerry were visiting the show and ended up holding Fritz whilst I continued

in the showring. It then began to drizzle, and a wet sheep is not ideal for the showring. Gerry went to our show box to retrieve towels which were then placed over Fritz.

The Parish Council

At our last meeting we welcomed Sarah Toll to the Parish Council. Sarah lives with her partner Keith in Pattishall and is looking forward to becoming more actively involved in the parish.

THE PRECEPT

One of the most onerous tasks of the council is setting the budget for the next f nancial year. This has to cover a variety of jobs that fall under the jurisdiction of the council such as maintenance of the churchyard and wall, footpaths, bus service, grass mowing and street lighting. With costs predicted to rise quite considerably the council is aware that there will be an inevitable uplift in the precept for the following year. Each

member of the Parish Council has an area of responsibility and Fiona Mytton has produced a very helpful report and projected costings of street lighting over the next couple of years. The following is an overview of the report as presented to fellow council members at our November meeting.

What is happening?

Pattishall Parish Council provides 110 streetlights for the parish. Following a review, we have decided that we need to upgrade most of them. Over one hundred have sodium lanterns and it is very hard to f nd spares when they fail. We will replace these lanterns with LED lanterns which have a more natural white light than the orange glow of our sodium lanterns. LED lanterns use much less electricity, require less maintenance, and have lower carbon emissions. Seven of our streetlights have concrete columns. These are believed to be over 40 years old! While they have served us well, they are now at the end of their life and will be replaced by steel columns with LED lanterns.

When will this take place?

The upgrading will be phased with the f rst phase starting shortly. During this phase we hope to replace the concrete columns, f t LED lanterns when sodium lanterns fail, and renumber all the lights so it is easier to report faults and get them f xed. The second phase will start in April 2022. The remaining lights will be upgraded in phase 3 commencing in April 2023.

What will it cost?

At an estimated cost of some £43k, upgrading will not come cheap but can be spread over 3 or 4 years. The council is currently looking to fund the f rst phase of the project by savings and reserves. Although, we have identif ed some savings to pay for the second

phase of the project, it is unfortunately clear that, we have no alternative but to increase the precept, the amount of money West Northants Council raise on our behalf to fund our services. We will try to keep this increase as small as possible and are currently working out how much council tax bills will have to rise as a result.

At the moment, we spend nearly £12k a year on keeping our streetlights lit. The LED lanterns will save us money as our electricity bill will reduce and our ongoing maintenance costs will be lower. They will also be more environmentally friendly. We will be back in touch when we have more information to tell you about our plans.

QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

In early June the WI are hoping to hold a cream tea in the parish hall to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the council have agreed to donate £150 towards the costs of the day. Likewise, a donation of £100 has been given towards the cost of The Over Sixties Christmas Lunch. The council is happy to help organisations whilst there are funds for such support, as it helps to foster a community spirit within our parish.

Mud on the Roads

Once again our villages have been blighted with mud being deposited by farm machinery on our roads. This now appears to be becoming a regular event twice a year with no remedial action being taken. It is appreciated that we live in a working environment but the amounts now being deposited are dangerous for road users and could result in a very serious accident. We do receive complaints from parishioners but generally after the event. Highways do not fall within the remit of the Parish Council; it is the responsibility of the Highways WNC.

The correct procedure for complaint is to use 'Street Doctor'. There is a sub section 'Roads/Mud on roads' where you will f nd a 24 hour telephone helpline. If the Council considers this to be a dangerous event they will attend and clear the road. You can also email highways.ncc@westnorthants.gov.uk outlining any problems.

Cold Higham Parish Burial Ground

The Parish Council have had no reply relating to our request for information about the memorial stone for George William Roberts or his wife Florence Winifred Roberts (they both passed away in the 1980's). For safety reasons we will now have to lay the memorial stone down on the burial plot. This will be undertaken in the early part of January.

The wall at the A5 end of Mill Lane has been broken for some time. The PC has reported this to WNC, who have responded that it is likely to be inspected in mid December. We will keep residents updated on progress.
