SUMMER is coming and it's time to get the fishing rods out – AND to get your club card passport to the best that Towcester & District has to offer.

And it has a lot – especially for those who like their fishing in away from it all, peaceful, countryside settings. ASTWELL MILL, near Wappenham and pretty as a picture, is a premier Tench fishing which has produced fish to 7lb+ – along with good Roach, Rudd, Bream, Pike and a few Crucians.

SILVER LAKE, a mile or so from Astwell, is our Carp water with fish topping 20lb, Roach of 2lb+, Bream, big Perch, a few Orfe and even a Barbel or two. And then there is our canal fishing and some on the Tove.

Over the past couple of years TDAA has spent thousands of pounds, and a lot of volunteer hours, improving its stillwaters to make them better than ever value. Hundreds of extra Tench – some up to 4lb

– have been added to Astwell Mill (traditional close season) with scores of carp, some to almost 10lb, added to Silver Lake's existing stocks.

The money for those fish came from club funds, donations from the owners of the waters, and £1,500 of member donations! Then, thanks to Environment Agency grants, there has been a whole raft of access and habitat improvements. Pattishall Primary School

It was brilliant to have so many parent volunteers in school on Saturday 21st May to prune, sweep, jet wash and paint to spruce up the grounds in preparation for our Jubilee Jamboree on Friday 10th June, where there will be a barbecue, bar, cream teas, festival tent, fire engine, tractor, games and performances by the children – including a maypole dance!

This is light relief in contrast to the shadow that covid-19 has continued to cast throughout this academic year. Yet, in spite of staff shortages and pupil absences, the team of staff, pupils and parents have pulled together to provide as close to business as usual as we can. This includes concluding the year with the Year 1 phonics screening, Year 2 exams, Year 4 multiplication check and Year 6 exams – the children have done us proud, working hard to be the best that they can be.

In January, we welcomed an inspection from Ofsted and were delighted to remain a good provider. The inspector was particularly impressed with our pastoral care and attention to mental health and wellbeing. She cited us as an inclusive school where the children are polite, well-behaved and attentive. She also commented that the children were taught about diversity and are aspirational. But above all, pupils, staff and parents say the children are happy and safe in school.

One of the things that the inspector commented on was the wide range of opportunities afforded to our children that broaden their horizons – this included taking our 30-strong choir to the O2 Arena in London to perform as part of the Young Voices choir, with 8000 other children from all over the country. The choir, led by Mr May, have spent nearly a year learning the songs, as the concert was cancelled last year due to covid. We are very grateful to the Parish Council for supporting the next generation by contributing towards the coach to transport us.

The children in Years 3 and 4 had a magical trip to Legoland recently, to round off their topic work on Best of British. They visited Miniland and explored all the famous landmarks of the UK. Year 6 are looking forward to visiting the West Midlands Safari Park, whilst Years 1 and 2 will be going to the Peterborough Showground to reinforce their learning in their topic Field to Fork.

At the time of writing, Year 5 and 6 are preparing for their end of year performance of Matilda; and Year 6 are beginning to think about their move to secondary school, with transition days planned. We are also re-launching our house teams in preparation for a 'normal' sports day in July. The children will be in 4 teams: beech (green), elm (blue), oak (red) and ash (yellow); the trees representing our logo, our link to Campion Secondary and also our recently acquired Forest School status.

We are very proud that Mr May qualified as a Level 3 Forest School instructor at the beginning of this year. The course was intense and incredibly thorough, and the outcome of all that hard work and dedication is that all children in our school now receive 6 weeks of Forest School every year that they are with us!

Please help us to save Beggars Lane in Astcote

Or more particularly Bridleway RT30 to give it its correct name.

As part of the DHL planning application on land to the north of Bell Plantation, there is a proposal, subject to DHL gaining planning approval, to use a field, part of the way down the bridleway, as a tip for surplus spoil from the DHL construction site. This historic right of way was used in the past by shoe workers from the surrounding area to travel to their place of work in Astcote.

The contractor who has prepared the plan proposes to use 8 wheel articulated vehicles with a maximum loaded weight of 30 tonnes to travel down the bridleway from Astcote High Street to deposit the spoil in a field adjacent to the bridleway, the quantity of which is unknown as is the duration of the works.

As those of you who use the bridleway will appreciate, whether you are a rambler, a walker out for a stroll, a dog walker or a horse rider, the bridleway is totally unsuitable for this purpose. The lane itself is a narrow track, with narrow margins and has relatively deep ditches on either side. There is nowhere for these vehicles to pass or turn round other than in the field.

The effect on the bridleway would be devastating not only on the flora and fauna but upon local users of the bridleway. Imagine coming face to face with a contractor's vehicle and nowhere to get out of its way.

This proposal needs stopping for the sake of the local inhabitants, the users of the bridleway and the wildlife.

You can object to the proposal in several ways.

Please add your voice to the voice of the parish council to prevent this local amenity from being ruined. The more noise we can make the more we cannot be ignored.

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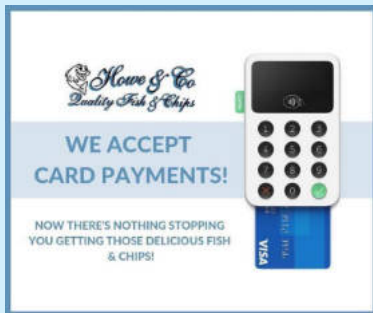

Chairman's Annual Report (2021-2022)

Although a less challenging year, the shadow of the pandemic still prevails, but slowly life in the parish is returning to normal with many events such as the Produce Show and the Over 60s Christmas Party taking place. As we look to the future it is great to see that Picnic in the Park will be back this summer along with other events planned throughout the remainder of the year. The council would like to thank all those involved in organising and participating in parish events and are pleased to help towards sponsorship where they can, such as helping to fund the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations organised by Pattishall Women's Institute.

In late spring of last year, we learned of the sad news that Robert Hart, a long standing and much valued member of the parish council, had passed away. Robert had for many years looked after the maintenance of the parish whether it be mending playground equipment regenerating wooden benches or even repositioning graveyard headstones. We are grateful for the time and dedication he had devoted to the parish over many years. In March Phil Paris, Vice Chair, stepped down from the council to devote more time to family and other commitments. Phil was an active member of the Council getting involved in numerous projects and was keen to get things done on behalf of our parishioners.

We welcomed Sarah Toll and Andrew Burley as new members to the council. Sarah who lives in Pattishall has taken on the responsibility of the def brillator situated at the primary school and she has also set up the parish council Facebook page. Andrew, who lives in Astcote, has taken on the role of maintenance and is at present undertaking an audit of the benches throughout the parish in order to propose a schedule of maintenance.

During the last year we also learned of the sad death of Duncan Townsend. Duncan and his family had for many years kept our verges, playing fields and village greens beautifully mown. Duncan was born in the parish, lived in the parish, and worked in the parish and was a familiar face and a good friend to many including the parish council.

No doubt the cost-of-living crisis has and will continue to impact on our daily lives. Thankfully, the council had anticipated that we would be faced with a hike in costs to provide services within the parish not least the colossal increase in the cost of energy. We sincerely hope that the precept we have set for the following year will allow for the inevitable increases in all areas of our budget and will still allow enough funds to support organisations and activities within the parish.

Street lighting continues to be one of our biggest expenditures mainly through the replacement of concrete columns to be replaced by metal ones. The concrete columns are suffering from a condition commonly known as concrete cancer which erodes the column making it unsafe. We have seven of those columns within our parish and all are in the process of being replaced. We are also replacing spent bulbs with the more efficient LED ones. The cost of these bulbs is more expensive but in the long run their use will reduce our overall lighting bill.

After many months of negotiation with West Northants Council we came to the conclusion that no money was forthcoming for the installation of play equipment at the Booth Close Play Area. With only a couple of swings the council felt there was a need for more play equipment, as there are many families with young children in that area who would benefit. I am pleased to say that play equipment has been ordered and should be installed in the late spring along with the bench donated by the widow of Morris Rolls, a former resident of the

parish, and kindly refurbished by John Russell.

We are pleased that we have the funds to help the school where appropriate as the primary school is one of our main assets within the parish and as we know their education budget does not always provide for all the activities they would like to provide for their pupils.

For The Queens Platinum Jubilee we were asked to plant trees which we did in the allotments. Two heritage fruit trees, a Queens apple, and a Five Gables pear, have been planted by Laura Dark at the far side of the allotments in Eastcote, hopefully to bear fruit in later years.

This year's Litter Pick was well attended, helped by Phillipa's coffee and treats on sale for pickers as they congregated on a sunny March morning. Surprisingly after no Litter Pick last year there was less litter and debris! Thanks to Dale Furniss for collecting the black bin bags and depositing them for collection.

Speeding within the parish still remains a problem, not least on the A5 through Fosters Booth. The council are aware of the problem and are looking at ways to address it but dealing with the Highways department is sadly rather a tenuous exercise. But as the saying goes 'Nothing ventured.....'. Elsewhere we keep getting numerous complaints about the speeding traffic on Butchers Lane and Astcote High Street. Again, the council have been in touch with Highways and there has been a police traffic control van seen at the top of Butchers Lane. Because of the nature of the road, we are not allowed any form of traffic calming along this stretch.

May I thank Linda Hemming, our Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator for helping to keep the council and parishioners informed. Andy Stewart for his sterling work in producing Around Pattishall and Iris Illingworth & Suzanne Raper for their contributions to parish life.

Finally, thanks go to my fellow councillors and our clerk, Ann Addison, for all their help and efforts throughout the past year.



Street Lights – Update

This month EON, who maintain our street lighting,

replaced 6 concrete columns in the first phase of upgrading our street lights. The columns, which were in The Beeches, Birds Hill, Booth Close, and Simon's Walk were believed to be over 40 years, but were at the end of their life as they suffer from a form of concrete cancer. The columns were replaced by steel columns with LED lanterns. These use much less electricity, require less maintenance and will, therefore, in the long run save us money. The parish now has only one concrete column which we want to replace as soon as possible.

The contractor has apologised, and the light has now been replaced at the contractor's cost.
