Student Grants 2022/23

Off to college or university? Studying for an apprenticeship?

If you are living in the Parish of Pattishall and are going to start studying this autumn, or will be continuing a college or a university course or an apprenticeship, then you may be eligible for a grant from the Pattishall Waites Charity.

The grant can help to pay towards tools/ equipment that relate to the course. This is not means tested and depending on the number of applicants the grant this year is expected to be in the region of £100 per student.

Poor's Allotment Charity Cold Higham/Grimscote

Each year the Trustees of the above charity are able to 'apply the income of the Charity in relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the Parish of Cold Higham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress, by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons'.

In practice this means that funds may be available for:

- 1. Households with at least one householder being aged 65 or over may be granted an amount to help with heating bills. Once a grant has been given it will be given annually without the need to make a new application.
- 2. Students in higher education needing to purchase books or tools or to pay for travelling expenses. A grant may be applied for each year whilst in higher education.
- 3. Any other person in need or distress at any time of the year

Because of the diff culties experienced by the Trustees in identifying eligible people, those wishing to claim a grant should apply in writing to Mrs Nita Pearson (who is a Trustee of the Charity) by email or post, as follows:

Applications need to be received by 3rd November 2022. The Trustees wish to pay grants online from now on so applications should include the name of the applicant's bank account, the sort code and account number. Existing recipients of the fuel grant will be contacted direct for their details.

Members of the community 'in need or distress' can apply to the Charity at any time.

Salvation for Your Old Clothes

The Salvation Army Clothing bin at Pattishall Parish Hall is well utilised by many residents. The bin is emptied regularly

and the clothing is sorted at the Salvation Army warehouse in Kettering before being sold in their charity shops.

The charity now has a new infrared scanner which it hopes will turn unwearable donations into new clothes. The government-funded scanner detects the type and colour of garments that are deemed too scruffy or damaged to sell and sorts them into wool. cotton, polyester or viscose. They are then sent to a mill in Huddersf eld to be spun into varn balls and used to make new jumpers, cardigans and socks.

This is a pilot scheme and the Salvation Army hopes to become the UK's f rst 'f bre farm' for donated clothing.

Pattishall Bells Leave the Tower After 114yrs!

It's been a busy and exciting summer for the Pattishall bellringers as we have seen the project to rehang and augment our bells moving into the 'action' phase!

The f rst excitement came in early July when a small group of us travelled to Asten in the Netherlands to see our two new bells being



cast at the Roval E sbouts Bell Foundry. It was fascinating to see the various stages of the casting process and to feel the heat as the red hot liquid

metal was so carefully poured into the moulds for our very own bells.

The hard work began in late August - it was time to dismantle and remove our existing bells, f ttings and frame, for transport to the works of Nicholson Engineering, Bridport. In dismantling the bell frame we came to respect Gillett and Johnston who installed the bells in 1908. Putting it another way. dismantling it was seriously hard graft! (Ask Nigel!)

Following our last ring on the bells at practice on Monday 22nd Aug, a small team of volunteers worked for two days to unbolt and remove the clappers, wheels, pulley blocks and various parts of the bell frame. The heavy work of removing and lowering the bells and the cast iron bell frame would wait for the arrival of Ian Hasman from Nicholson's (the Bell Hanger) a week later. Ian would be ably assisted by four volunteers each day, and the f ve-man team worked well into the evenings to get everything down, ready to be loaded onto a lorry on Friday.



Day 1 started with the opening up of the foors in the belfry and clock chamber and setting up an electric hoist and various chain hoists. By the end of the day we had lowered 5 bells, which were now lined up in the main aisle, various parts

of the bell frame and the Sanctus bell together with its ancient wooden frame. Fantastic progress - well beyond expectations!

Day 2 saw the tenor bell (~600 kg) being lowered together with the rest of the frame (except for one RSJ). I gloss over the detail concerning the fact that the tenor did not

ft through the hole in the clock chamber f oor! This required a certain amount of lateral thinking!... The removal of the bell frame was tough work. Each of the nine RSJs was cemented into the tower walls to a depth of ~15", and would need to be broken out before they could be removed.



Day 3 started with one task to be completed: lower the one remaining RSJ. We would need to cut this in half. Four hours later and it was being lowered to the f oor below. We were

by now in a celebratory mood!

Day 4 began with everything being moved out into the churchyard. What a site to see the six bells lined up down the church path - the f rst time the bells had been out of the tower since 1908! The lorry arrived at 10 am and, soon after, local farmer Richard Burt rolled down the road from Manor Farm in a fork lift



truck! Unbeknown to us the haulage company had arranged for Richard to load the bells onto the lorry. By lunchtime the task was completed and the lorry set off on its journey to Nicholson's works in Bridport.

A new frame is to be manufactured and constructed at Bridport, the wheels and f ttings to be refurbished and the two new bells tuned to match with the existing bells. In the meantime, building works will be undertaken to prepare the tower for the installation of the new bell frame, and the sound level control system will be f tted behind the louvres. It is planned that the bells, frame and f ttings will be returned to Pattishall in November or early December with the hope that the bells will be ringing out over the village in time for Christmas.

Thanks to Ian Hasman of Nicholson's Engineering and local volunteers Nigel Emson, Andy Blackwell, Jonathan Stuart, Chris Bulleid, Nigel Williams, Chris Aslett & Geoff White. We gelled to form a fantastic team, achieving the near impossible in the time. Thanks also to Richard Burt. for expertly loading everything onto the lorry, and friendly lorry driver John. Special thanks to Libby and Adrian Covington for generously providing B&B for lan the bellhanger; Margaret Bulleid for plying the crew with tea and cakes; Julie Bunker and Wendy Watts for helping to clean up all the mess!!

Many thanks also to the Parish Council and our wider community for agreeing that the Show should go ahead, despite the sad loss of Her Majesty The Queen just three days earlier.

This year's Show was a wonderful celebration of village life and community, and a fitting tribute to our late Queen. Before the cups were awarded, John Atkin gave a short address reflecting on Queen Elizabeth's life of service, followed by a prayer and two minutes' silence. Barry Evans, in his role as Chair of the Parish Council, then read the Proclamation of Accession of King Charles III.

Having had to cancel the 2020 Show because of Covid-19, followed by a small but enjoyable socially distanced show in 2021, this year's Show was truly bigger and better than ever! 72 individuals exhibited a record-breaking total of 489 entries. It was a joy to welcome our children in on 5th September and see that not a beat was missed with Maths and English lessons in full swing by 9am on day one! We are working together as a community this year to ensure that our presentation, engagement, attendance, communication and homework are second to none. Everyone has been working hard – starting as we mean to go on.

As a school community we keenly felt the loss of HM Queen Elizabeth II. Mr May played the bugle on 9th September to signify the start of a two-minute silence. We then gathered in the hall to celebrate the amazing life and achievements of Her Majesty. We sent our prayers to her family and to King Charles III and looked forward to this next chapter in our history.

We have a busy term ahead of us; with harvest festival, a residential to the Frontier Centre for Year 6, European Languages Day, a Music Café, parents' evenings, Remembrance service, Black History Month and of course all that Christmas brings! Here is a taste of what the children have been getting up to in the f rst week of term:

Reception - Our Reception children have had a wonderful start and are settling into school life. We are getting to know one another with lots of games and new friendships are being made. Miss Dalton.

Year 1 - Year 1 have had a brilliant f rst week! In Science, we are learning about animals so we took a walk around the village to see what animals we could f nd. We also transformed our classroom into a train so that we could go on a journey through the countryside and into a city. This journey has helped us write some brilliant sentences for a story about going on a train ride. This term, our topic is Our Local Area so we spent a lesson f nding Pattishall on the map and locating our school. Some of the children even managed to f nd the roads they live on. Next week, we will be using our street maps to go on a walk around our local area and plot on any key features we see. Mrs Green.

Year 2 - We have been out on the school f eld hunting for objects that we could sort into living, dead and never been alive. We gently used paintbrushes to collect the living minibeasts and returned them to where we found them afterwards! We have also been looking at the work of Piet Mondrian and trying to create our own versions using coloured paper squares and rectangles.

We have had some special visitors to launch our f rst English unit. Three owls came to school so that we can learn all about them before reading The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark. Miss Bruce

Year 3 and 4 - Having recently become a joint Year 3 and 4 class, we have been getting to know each other. We are starting new topics of 'British Artists' and 'Northamptonshire' and look forward to discovering a bit more about where we live. We are focusing on the animal kingdom in Science, discovering similarities and differences between different species. We are exploring the wonderful picture book 'The Blue House' in English, which explores the themes of loss, support, coping with change and looking to the future. The children have much to look forward to this Autumn Term, including a choir trip to Peterborough Cathedral. Mr May.

Year 5 have had an excellent f rst week back. We have started our geography topic on Climate Change and our new class book – Twitch. The children have all made some excellent predictions about what is to come in our story and we will have to wait and see over the coming weeks how accurate we are! We have started our sessions with S4A learning to be Sports Crew and we are looking forward to the reception children joining full time so we can meet our buddies and help them to settle into life at Pattishall. Cold Calling

Door to Door Fundraisers should not knock on the doors of properties that display a "No Cold Calling" sticker. The Police value phone calls to identify cold calling/door knocking.

If you require a yellow "No Cold Calling" sticker for doors/windows please contact the Coordinator.

Police Cybercrime Team

Part of what they do, as well as investigating, is to give advice and inform people how to protect themselves against Cyber Crime. Main Points:

Criminals target everyone. They will access anything. Not just payment details but personal information which they can use against you and to use it to attack companies you work with or colleagues or friends.

Securing Accounts

When we use passwords we need to make sure they are strong and long at least 12 characters. One good way is to take 3 random words and put those words together.

Close dormant or unwanted accounts. We all have old accounts that we don't use any more. Close them down. There is a chance that if these companies are breached or make a mistake criminals could get hold of your passwords.

Minimise information.

Using a different password for each account: your email should def nitely have a different password. If your password is leaked online criminals will try every account you have used online. Within a few hours criminals will have worked through each account and taken control. Emails are important.

Data Breaches

There is a website you can safely put your email address in and it will tell you whether any email you have set up in the past with that email account has had a data breach. The website is: <u>haveibeenpwned.com</u>. If you have had a data breach it is worth closing that account or choosing a strong password.

Grass Upkeep Contracts

Rising costs due to inf ation etc has already resulted in an increase in grass cutting/ strimming costs for 2022. With no sign of inf ation dropping or fuel costs returning to a lower level in the near future the Council is looking into ideas as to how it can maintain current funding going forward.

Notice Board in Grimscote.

The notice board in Grimscote is in a state of disrepair and the Council are looking into replacing it with a new one within the next 6 months. Quotes have been obtained for suitable replacements and a decision will be taken in the near future which one to pursue.

Council Electricity Supply

Along with everyone else, the council has had to contend with ever-rising electricity costs for our street lights. Fortunately, as all lights are now low-cost LED, the rise is less than it might otherwise have been. During a frantic June, when the few offers of contracts available from suppliers were changing literally on an hourly basis, and on advice from Northants CALC, we were able to switch to another energy supplier, Yu Energy, to secure a three year deal at a 'reasonable' price.

DHL Warehouse Update

'Save Towcester Now' have enlisted a Planning Consultant to report on the Supplementary Planning Guidance Document (SPD) put forward for consultation. There are 11 recommendations from the Consultant ranging from greater detail and cumulative traff c assessments to size of proposed units. More can be seen at HOME | Save Towcester Now . Public responses to the SPD closed on 18th August

Improving Towcester – Public Consultation


