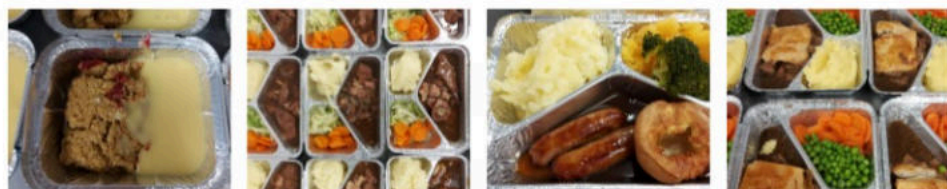

Despite it being very cold and dark, this term is known as Spring term (there is no winter in education!). I love this as it gives us such hope for warmer, brighter days ahead. February half term sees us already halfway through the academic year, with all children continuing to make excellent progress.

Reception have been busy learning about the lunar new year and are beginning to think about planting seeds.

Year 1 have been learning about the UK, in particular London. They have also been comparing London to Brasilia to explore similarities and differences.

Year 2 have been focusing on Africa – in particular Kenya. They have learned all about the Maasai tribe in recent weeks. They have also learnt about the four different types of sentences and how to use them in their own written work.

Years 3 and 4 have been very musical so far this term. They are all learning a brass instrument as part of the NMPAT (Northampton Music and Performing Arts Trust) First Access Scheme and are busily rehearsing for their production of 'Rock Bottom' – a musical about the Stone Age. We can't wait to see it!

Year 5 have been learning about global trade and how trade routes have changed through the decades and why. They have also been learning about reversible and irreversible changes in science.

Year 6 are gearing up for their exams in May, but there is still plenty to be done! They have been reading 'Journey to River Sea' and learning all about the Amazon rainforest. This has extended to their Design Technology work, where they have been building moving toys using cams.

2nd March is World Book Day and we are looking forward to celebrating this year with a watery theme – focusing mainly on how climate change is impacting on our oceans. Our school council has three main agendas this year: to become an eco-friendlier school; to improve the school environment and to raise money for CLIC and Water Aid charities.

We continue to go from strength to strength with many exciting opportunities ahead!

Pattishall Produce Show Update Save the date – Sunday 10 Sept 2023

It may not officially be spring quite yet, but signs of new life and growth are unmistakable and so welcome after this cold winter. As I write, snowdrops, aconite, and crocus are in bloom, buds are swelling on trees and shrubs, and we have just caught sight of the first new lambs. A wonderful time of year, and just the right moment to turn our thoughts to the vegetable, fruit, flowers, and plants section of the Produce Show! Whether you garden on an allotment or in a container, everyone can grow *something* to enter – let's see what we get this year for "heaviest marrow" or "strangest shaped vegetable"!

SECTION A: VEGETABLES

Unless specified, all categories are 'any variety'

- Five onions
- Five potatoes
- Three carrots (with tops)
- Five pods of French beans
- Five runner beans
- Five large tomatoes
- Five small tomatoes
- Three courgettes
- Three beetroots (trimmed)
- One cucumber
- One pumpkin or squash (not courgette / marrow)
- Sweetcorn – two ears
- Longest runner bean
- Longest parsnip
- Heaviest marrow
- Strangest shaped vegetable
- A tray of mixed vegetables (max 5 kinds in an attractive display)

SECTION B: FRUIT

- Three apples
- Largest apple
- Three pears
- Five plums or damsons
- A plate of berries – single or mixed varieties
- A tray of mixed fruit (max 5 kinds in an attractive display)

SECTION C: EGGS (Poultry)

All fresh eggs to be brought in whole

- One egg
- Three matching eggs
- Heaviest egg
- Brightest yolk
- One decorated egg (decorated by entrant since the 2022 show – can be a bought or raised egg – from any kind of poultry)

SECTION D: FLOWERS & PLANTS

- Three roses of same or differing varieties
- Rose, one specimen
- Dahlia, three blooms
- One houseplant
- One cactus or succulent in a pot
- Vase of home-grown mixed flowers (horticultural, not artistic quality)

Councillor News

We are delighted to welcome Iris Illingworth as a new member to council. Iris is well known for her work on the Parish Hall & Playing fields Committee and brings a wealth of knowledge to the team. Iris has been very successful in getting funding for various projects and we hope that she will use these talents to help raise grants for future activities.

Street Lighting

The council has nearly completed its replacement of the old concrete columns which were showing signs of 'concrete cancer'. The last one in Valley End will be replaced in the week of March 27th or sooner if EON have availability. After inspection this column is now a priority to be replaced and it is requested that no cars be parked under the light until the decaying column has been removed. Dog Bins & Poo

There was discussion as to whether another dog poo bin was needed throughout the parish. There has been an increase in doggie poo bags just discarded along footpaths, especially where those paths go through grass and arable fields. Please put your pet's present in the bins provided or in your black bin at home. At this time of the year there will be sheep and their new borne lambs around, so do ensure that your dog is fully under control around livestock.

Green Bins

West Northants Council are considering raising the green bin collection to £58. Our ward councillors are strongly opposed to this increase and will lobby the council to try to reduce the proposed increase.

‘Philippa Replacement’

Many residents felt that it would be a good idea to see if another mobile food/beverage waggon would be interested in replacing Philippa at the parish hall. This is going to be investigated but if any residents have ideas or contacts then please do pass them on to one of the parish councillors.

DHL Warehouse

The DHL Planning Application has been put back and will now be heard by the WNC Planning Committee on March 20th at the earliest. This is in response to the many unresolved concerns raised by various bodies and an independent review (commissioned by WNC) of the DHL's own Landscape and Visual Impact (LVIA) Study, including latest amendments to take into account DHL's latest offer to reduce maximum warehouse heights from 24.5m to 21.5m. The King's Coronation

The parish council and parish hall committee are working together to produce a suitable programme of events for the Coronation weekend (6-8 May). A Coronation committee has been set up and will be meeting regularly to maintain focus on the event. The web site and Nextdoor will be used to keep people informed.

Vehicle Activated Speed (VAS) Indication Signs

The decision on placing a sign is still on going in terms of which company to use. We hope to decide at the March meeting and then progress on to the grant application and installation.

HGV issues in Grimscoate

Currently there are temporary "Not Suitable for Heavy goods vehicles" signage at the South end of Manor Road. This has been necessary due to ongoing problems with large vehicles accessing the area via these

approaches. Recently a large vehicle had become wedged between the wall and bollards in Manor Road resulting in green verges being damaged. We have contacted the Highways department to enquire around permanent signage and if it is available and if not, what other options were there. We are awaiting a response.

Street Lights

It has been noted that there is a damaged streetlight sited at the Fosters Booth end of Banbury Lane. This was a street light that had recently undergone repair by E-ON. This will be reported to E-ON for an inspection and repair.

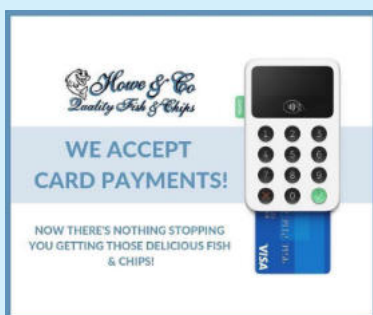
