## Wild Flower Garden

The wildf ower area in Holy Cross churchvard was developed in 2000 as part of the Parish Millennium project. Since then it has been looked after by volunteers and supported by the Parish Council. Over time it has been overtaken by some dominant plants so work is underway to clear sections and re-establish more wild f owers. Bulbs of English bluebells, fritillaria, daffodils and wild garlic are going to be planted for the Spring. It is hoped that in the early summer there will be a greater display of wild f owers.

On January 11th we will be inviting back Kate Wills, a local historian who speaks on aspects of Northamptonshire's history.


The February 8th event is to be announced.



Transport is booked and the bells and all associated parts are due to arrive in the village on Monday 20th November. Then the work of lifting the new bell frame into the tower can begin.





School has got off to a good start this term, with the release of our Ofsted report - available to read on our website: Ofsted, SIAMS and Results (pattishallschool.co.uk). Although we already knew it... Ofsted says that we are a GOOD school!

It can't be underestimated the signif cance of this achievement and the incredible work the teachers have put in over the past 18 months to build a bespoke curriculum from scratch.

Thankfully this was recognised by the inspection team who noted that maths, reading, personal development, our nurturing ethos, provision for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) and leadership were all key strengths.

#### Some of the highlights

- Pattishall Church of England Primary School is a friendly and inclusive school.
   Pupils enjoy coming to school and feel safe in this nurturing environment.
- Staff are ambitious for all pupils and want the very best for them. They are determined that all pupils, including those with SEND, receive the support they need to f ourish and achieve well.
- Children get off to a good start in the early years. The school carefully considers children's transition into school. Children are happy and know the class routines.
   Teachers are passionate and knowledgeable and create a warm and caring environment.
- The school has designed a well-sequenced curriculum that enables pupils to build key knowledge over time.
- The school carefully considers how pupils will develop their character and values.
   There is a sense of community and respect, where older pupils become 'buddies' for younger children.

We have continued to host a number of wellattended events this year which has enabled us to raise some much needed funds for the hall. From "Soup and Rolls" in the Spring, to Summer "Garden Tea & Cakes" and two very successful quizzes; all events were enjoyed very much by those attending.

Great news, a def brillator has now been installed and registered at Pattishall Parish Hall. It is located outside the building so that it can be accessed by anyone in an emergency. It is to the right of the front doors, near the disabled parking.

Following a cardiac arrest the survival rate is 74% more successful if the patient has access to a def b within the f rst 3-5 minutes. Always ring 999 and the ambulance service will give you the code to the def b unit if necessary. Instructions will be given to you by phone and by the device itself. But if you would like to be prepared, check

out the Resuscitation Council UK's website or facebook page and watch the Def b Dani video. It takes you through the necessary steps and will give you the conf dence to help save a life.


# Crafts & Play

#### **Council News**

We still have a vacancy to f ll so do please contact our clerk, Ann Addison, for details should you feel that you would be interested in becoming a parish councillor. There are many interesting projects being considered and an additional resident to the council would be most welcome.

#### Roads & Safety

The possibility that the 30mph speed limit may be extended to the east as far as the development at Millf eld has met with a favourable response from Highways and we hope for a positive outcome. The state of Levs & Festival Roads remains a priority and again we look forward to Highways acting on the information as presented by the Council and through their visits to the area. Plans are afoot to put double yellow lines at the junction where Fosters Booth Road joins the A5. With vehicles parked so close to the junction it has become dangerous to users of this highway. The council is also looking to improve the VAS signs throughout the Parish and looking at ways they may be deployed.

#### **Hedges, Trees & Footpaths**

The council is looking to install 'kissing gates' along some of the footpaths. This would enable easier access for residents as well as for dogs. In all cases permission from the landlord is a prerequisite and that is not always forthcoming.

#### Lighting

It is now estimated that after the installation of LED lights and part night cells there has been at least a third less consumption of energy, which is good news in view of the rising energy costs. We have also received a detailed report of our parish, from the police, stating that there has been no increase in crime or traff c accidents since the part night cells were introduced.

#### **Anglian Water & Road Closures**

It appears that many residents have been experiencing diff culties with water pressure. The Parish Council has no inf uence or jurisdiction over private companies, but parishioners should contact the water authority directly with their concerns. Because of the problems encountered by Anglian Water a part of Butchers Lane was closed for longer than anticipated. There will be another closure in February (12<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup>) so please check the Parish website for details nearer the time.

#### **Mobile Phone Problems**

It appears that many residents are experiencing problems with the signal for their mobile phones. There are many suggestions as to the reasons, but in the meantime residents should contact their provider, who in many cases offer a refund for the time that service was not provided.

#### **Burial Plots**

The council is aware of the limited number of burial plots left in the churchyard. We are in the process of trying to extend the burial ground on the grassed area towards the church and hope for this to be approved. In the meantime, it has been suggested that the bank to the north of the burial ground be excavated to allow for additional plots.

#### Maintenance

Our noticeboards throughout the Parish are either being replaced or renovated and there will be new signage erected on our three playing f elds.

The roundabout at the playing f elds on School Road will soon be removed for the winter months but will return in the spring all newly renovated.

The council is committed to not only maintaining our present playground equipment but also to purchasing new items for our younger residents to enjoy.

#### **Minibus Service**

The Gayton & Tiff eld minibus service which is now operative in the Parish is offering Christmas shopping trips to Oxford & Milton Keynes in addition to their normal weekly service.

#### **Over Sixties Christmas Party**

The Parish Council is once again pleased to support this event with a donation of £150. A jolly time is being planned for Saturday, December 9<sup>th</sup>, so do come along and join in the fun.

#### Planning

The Parish Council has learned that West Northants Council has requested a Flood Assessment for the DHL site which adds to the mounting concerns raised about this development.

#### **Budget and Precept 2024/2025**

One of the biggest and most responsible jobs a PC has is to set the budget for the year covering everything from grass cutting to street light electricity. Being acutely aware of the pressures households face in the current climate, the Council is very keen to minimise the increase in precept for the coming year, which hasn't been raised in cash terms since 2020/21. This is always a signif cant challenge with rising costs and we know we must spend wisely and prudently, but our plan is to keep the cash increase as small as we can.

# Maintenance of Public Footpaths and Rights of Way

It was again brought to the attention of the Council that there are issues with overgrown rights of way/footpaths. This matter has been reported via Fix my Street. Cllr. Kimbell has raised the issue with the Voluntary Footpath Warden and has been advised that there are ownership changes currently taking place. It was agreed to contact the new owner once this is off cially known and make attempts to contact the WNC Rights of Way Team to f nd out what action can be taken. Cllr. Kimbell will discuss again with the Footpath Warden, undertaking an audit of the rights of way in the Parish, and surveying the condition paths, styles and gates etc.

#### **Churchyard/Cemetery**

The Council is reviewing the current Cemetery Policy through a working group That is looking at the current Cemetery regulations and rules and whether any changes are needed. This is still a work in progress. A review of the Cemetery and Churchyard grounds tree maintenance has also started. We are obtaining quotations for a schedule of tree and ground works to be carried out before the end of the year.

#### **DHL Warehouse**

WNC and National Highways are still assessing the traff c impact of the developments and are now looking at the impact as a whole. The latest hold on the application expired on 22<sup>nd</sup> November. (From Save Towcester Now Facebook page).

# Vehicle Activated Speed (VAS) Indication Signs

The decision on placing a sign is still ongoing in terms of which company to use but we are making progress! We hope to move this forward soon and progress on to the grant application and installation. There will be a meeting with the Highways Liaison Off ce to also discuss rumble strips through Cold Higham village.

#### **HGV** Issues in Grimscote

Currently in Grimscote there is temporary "Not Suitable for Heavy goods vehicles" signage at the south end of Manor Road. Several locations have been agreed as suitable for signage "No Access for HGV vehicles" including the A5, the telephone box

and the current location of the temporary sign. Helen Howard from Highways has agreed to obtain quotations for the signs and let us know when they are available.

#### **Telephone Box in Grimscote**

Thanks to kind residents, the phone box is now f nished. Very nice it looks too. The Parish Council is very grateful to the residents taking this on.

#### Fraud and Scam Awareness

There was a fraud and scam awareness talk given by the police as part of Neighbourhood Watch on 23<sup>rd</sup> November in Cold Higham Village Hall; the event lasted around an hour.

#### Def brillator at Cold Higham Village Hall

# Astcote Chapel 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary



2024 will see the 150th Anniversary of the Chapel building in Astcote although Methodists had been meeting for some time before 1874 in the
